

Sounding Car Horns in Salisbury Road

Residents are asking all drivers to leave their car horns alone when dropping off children in the morning or afternoon. Everyone understands the difficulties of navigating our tricky one way street, but please exercise patience if you choose to drive. Be considerate of those residents who sleep at this time for various reasons, such as night shifts. Thank you for your co-operation.



When is it illegal to use the car horn?

Inappropriate use of the car horn is dangerous and can distract other drivers, potentially leading to accidents. It's also important to consider other people's circumstances. Sounding your horn in built-up areas can affect people who are sleeping during the day due to sickness or due to working unsociable hours.

- Never sound your horn aggressively. Even if you are not at fault and a pedestrian or other road user acts dangerously, you must sound your horn only to alert them of your presence.
- Sounding the horn in anger, often after the event has occurred is in fact illegal and can see a motorist fined.
- While stationary on the road.
