Purple Class assembly

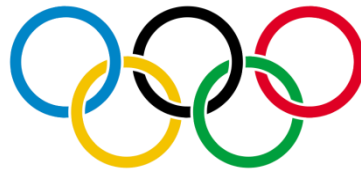
Purple Class told us lots of facts about the Olympics past and present during their assembly. They sang and even showed us how much they enjoy their own PE sessions by performing some gymnastics.
