Mother Child Education Program (MOCEP) for Turkish speaking parents

The Parents Group on Monday afternoon was a great success. 16 parents attended showing interest in the programme to support Turkish families and their children aged between 4-7 with strategies to use at home to enable their children to settle in or progress in their learning at school.

The programme is scheduled to start in October at Prince of Wales and involves 25 weekly meetings of 3 hours long. The sessions will cover topics such as relationships, resolving conflicts, listening to children, language used when speaking to the children, healthy eating and well- being.

MOCEP, which has been replicated in 13 countries and reaches over 700,000 people, has been shown to have a positive, long-lasting impact on mothers and children: participating children were more likely to go beyond compulsory education and demonstrate better cognitive and social development patterns into young adulthood than comparable children who did not participate. Studies have also shown that the programme's effects on employment and education lasted into young adulthood.



ICT visitors

On Thursday, a group of teachers from the Netherlands visited our school to see how ICT enhances learning. They visited many classrooms from Nursery to Year 6, the ICT room and the radio room, and were impressed by what they saw. They especially liked the variety of resources and way they were used to support learning. They took lots of ideas away with them. They thought the school was very welcoming, and commented on how both children and staff were enjoying their learning. They also commented that children worked well together, and that pupil targets and levels were clearly visible in the classrooms.

Bird Fortnight

During the last two weeks every class participating in Bird Fortnight. The children have been identifying and learning more about birds in our environment. Every class has made a bird feeder which the birds really must have appreciated in the snowy weather. Records of birds that have been spotted around school have been forwarded to the RSPB Birdwatch.
