Our Value for this month is Happiness

Can people reliably predict what will make them happy? Research suggests that people are actually quite poor at predicting accurately what will make them happy. This is why it is important that our pupils develop self-knowledge to help them focus on what makes them feel good. To feel happy and have a sense of well-being requires self-awareness. Children need to be taught how to identify and overcome inner obstacles to being happy – talking about 'Happiness' is a good place to start this process. Some questions that you might like to explore with your child this weekend are; What are the ingredients for a child to be happy? Can a school be a happy school, if so how/why? Is permanent happiness an illusion? Can your child say what will make them happy at school/home/with their peers?
