5T's Assembly





This week, Year 5 put on an assembly for their peers and parents, demonstrating some of the exciting things they had learned last half term. As October was Black History Month, we explored the lives of two very important black women: Floella Benjamin and Bessie Coleman. We looked at part of Floella Benjamin's autobiography. The children wrote part of their own autobiography. Next, children studied the biography of Bessie Coleman and used what they had learned to write part of her biography themselves.

Continuing with the Black History theme, Year 5 researched and learned about gospel music. Children used their ICT skills to research some current black musicians and how they have been influenced by gospel music. We linked this back to Bessie Coleman, she sung gospel music whilst working in the cotton fields.







During art last half term, Year 5 focused on Andy Warhol and his style of art; pop art. Children studied how he created his artwork as well as different techniques he used. They used Warhol's work as a stimulus for drawing a self-portrait. Then, through the use of ICT, transformed their pictures into a piece Andy Warhol style of art.


