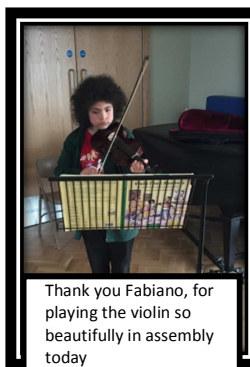

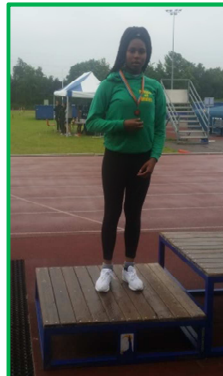
Well done to **3F** & **6H** for best attendance this week.
