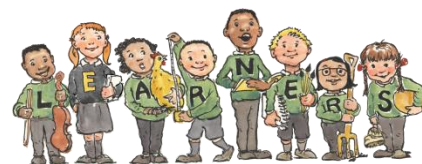

Science Corner – Year 6

This week we had two challenges in our Science lesson.



Challenge 1: This is called an energy stick. When you touch it at both ends, it lights up and makes a buzzing noise. Is it possible to use every child in the class at the same time to make it turn on? How do you think we did it? Answers in an envelope to Ms Blake.

Challenge 2: Can you make the bulb light? You are allowed to use silver foil, a battery (cell) and a bulb. Is there more than one way?

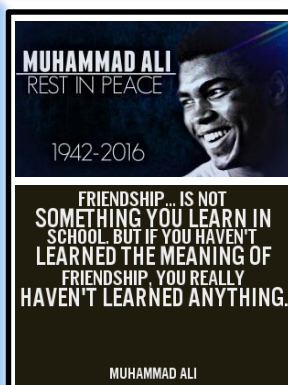
