Rights... and responsibilities



At school, we have two yellow books, which record detentions and escorted lunches. Children may receive a sanction for hurting another child, disrupting learning or saying unkind words. Nearly all of the misdemeanours recorded in these books are cases where children have tried to take the freedoms away from others.

We want a school where every child and adult feels safe, free to learn and play without disruption and feels comfortable in sharing their opinions without fear of criticism. If everyone were to follow our learners' values there would be no need for the yellow books and collectively we would all 'learn together and grow together' whilst feeling safe, secure and valued.

And, it appears that the last word on pumpkins hasn't been said vet

Mr Dunstone-Patterson's pumpkins continue to impact on our school; from being rather visible in the Harvest assembly, to a guess-my weight-or circumference competition and now a treat for the children and staff

Logan's family was unable to take the largest pumpkin home so Cem, school chef, took this large specimen to task

First she cut the large fruit (yes, see more about that on this page) in half. As you can see in the photos the fleshy pulp is rather thick and juicy looking and it smelled sweet. Perhaps a result of being fed with sugary water?

Cem cut away the fibrous strands with its seeds (we have kept some to grow new ones) and also removed the skin to create lots of slices: just like melons.

These were then all shredded.

She had prepared a base mix for sauces and the shredded pumpkin was mixed in. This base sauce can be used for a variety of foods such as curries, pasta Bolognese, lasagne and tomato sauces.

As you can see from the end result, they also made great cupcakes. The grated pumpkin is also a super ingredient for a sweet pumpkin and raisin pie.


Cem, our chef became very creative in the kitchen this week when she was presented with the enormous pumpkin.
