Dear Parents, Governors and Friends,

With the end of this school year in sight I am delighted to report that our current Year 6 cohort have indeed lived up to their ambitious targets and achieved the best results we have had. Whilst test data is just in and subject to some minor changes, I can already tell you that about 95% of pupils achieved a L4+ for reading with 67% L5s. In Maths 92% achieved a L4+ with 68% L5s.

Our strategies of the past 3 years to improve pupils' learning behaviours, employ the best teachers, improve leadership in all areas and forge closer partnerships with our families are paying off. Similar good results are seen across the school.

On Friday, pupils' end of year reports will be going home. I have read them all and enjoyed the well-written comments by teachers and the achievement leaders. The reports contain vital targets and advice for your children to work on. Many can be achieved over the summer holidays, so set aside dedicated time each day to read, practice writing or rehearse x-tables. If you are not sure how to help your child, do ask the class teacher.

One area that must improve is school attendance. We have again not reached our target of 95.5%. For our children, attendance is the difference between success and under-achievement. A good learner aims to be in school every day and on time.

Parents will be informed at Parents' Evening on Tuesday who their child's next teacher will be. On Wednesday, pupils will meet their new teacher as part of a whole week transition, where they will work each morning in their new classes.

I would like to thank all staff, parents, pupils, Governors, Local Authority and others who are on board with us to make this a successful school.

Our Value for this month is Unity


