
<u>Science Corner – Year 1</u>

The children in Year 1 are learning about their changing world. At the start of each half term we will explore plants, seasons and animals that live around our school. Over the year, the children will develop an understanding of how plants and animals change with seasons. We are learning through lots of practical science lessons. Year 1 made careful observations of the animals that they could find around the school. They then made a tally chart and discussed their findings. Some pupils researched online which animals they might see in different seasons. The children learnt how to make predictions too. *Mrs Stylli – Year 1 teacher*
