#### Dear Parents, Governors and Friends,

Many parents attended the 'Meet the Teachers' and 'School Vision' presentations earlier this week. If you have been unable to attend, a copy of the hand-outs are available from the class teachers and a summary of the school vision from the reception. With your children spending up to 15% in any given year at Prince of Wales, we work hard to ensure your children make at least good progress. However, we have little impact during the 85% time they spend outside school. The learning and developing of attitudes and behaviours that take place at that time obviously make all the difference to your child achieving their full potential.

Having chosen for your children to attend our school we expect that parents support our values, policies, procedures and expectations. These include the usual expectations such as wearing agreed school uniform (shoes, hair style, and jewellery), attendance and punctuality, completing homework, behaviour and use of language but also leaving toys at home, teaching children to use fork and knife, Nursery children being nappy trained and reading with your child at home. Your children's education is a responsibility that we whole heartedly share with you.

#### Our Value for this month is **RESPONSIBILITY**

Our LEARNERS Values remained a constant touch-stone in the school day. Children new to the school are starting to learn about our LEARNERS Values. The older children are taking responsibility to be 'Gold Medal Role Models' for the younger children. Our aim is to encourage the children to be proactive LEARNERS, through being responsible and organised for their school day. Why do we encourage the children to be proactive learners? When the children take responsibility for their learning, this has a positive impact on the pupils' behaviour for learning, progress, self-esteem, identity and their school/home lives too. *Mrs Stylli – PSHE, P4C and Values Co-ordinator*
