## Obituary: Our beloved chicken Priscilla has 'flown the nest'

Priscilla, the first ever chicken at our school, died on Thursday. She was fit and well up until then and died of old age; 7 is a very good age for a chicken. During the 7 years she has shared her eglu (coop) with several other chickens and has always been an excellent role model showing the new ones where to lay their eggs, where to forage for the juiciest worms and how to make a dry mud bath! The children take it in turns in looking after the chickens, collecting the eggs, feeding them and keeping their eglu clean. Her eggs have also been used in omelettes, cakes, pop overs, pancakes and puddings. She was a real character and if ever a door was open she would stroll into a classroom for some extra maths or English.
