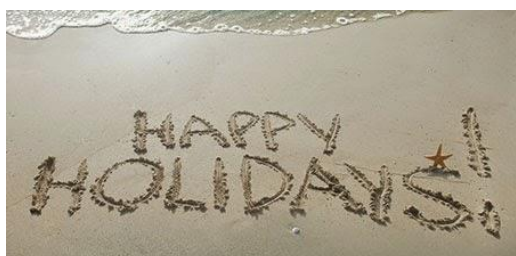

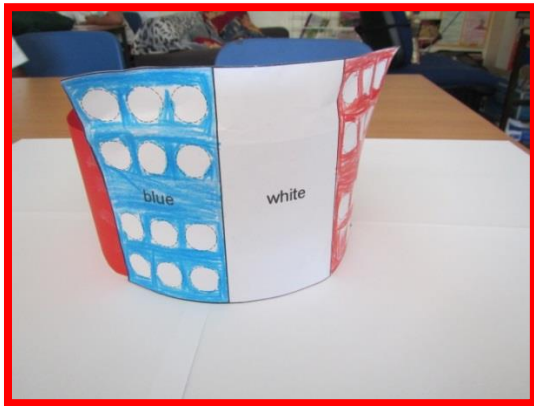

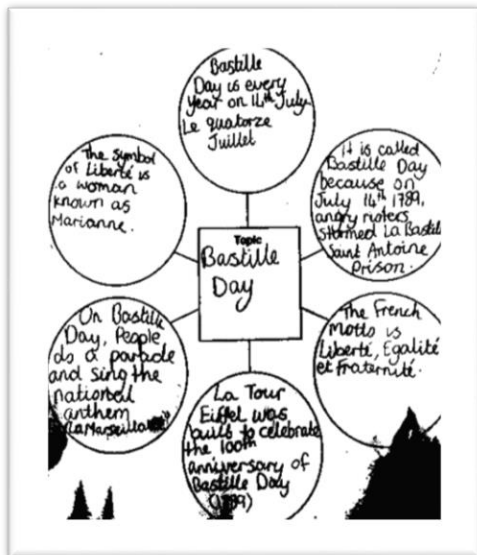
Year 1 French hat (Tricolor)



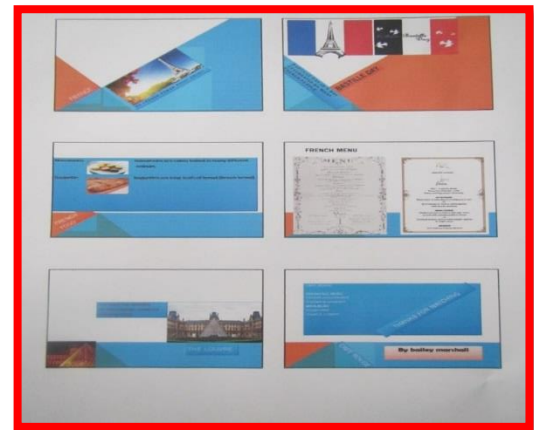
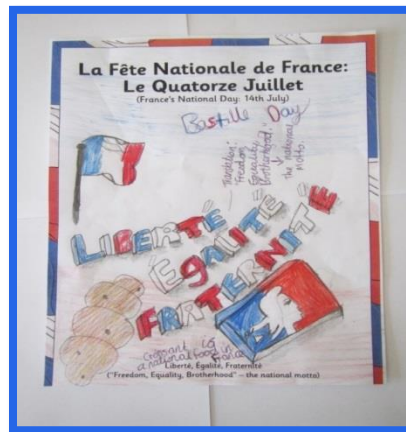
Year 1 Frenchman



Year 4 Bastille Day facts



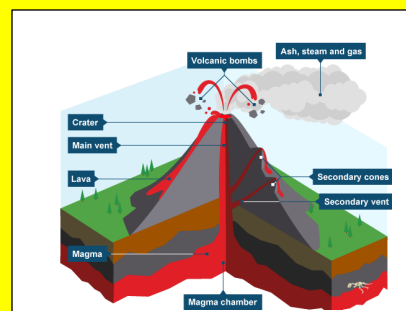
Year 5 PPT presentation

Class attendance of the year: 4F

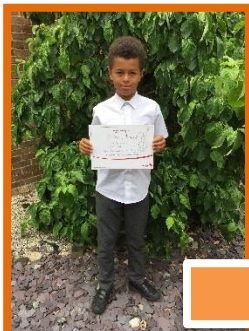

Well done Bailey for your achievement in learning to play the double bass.

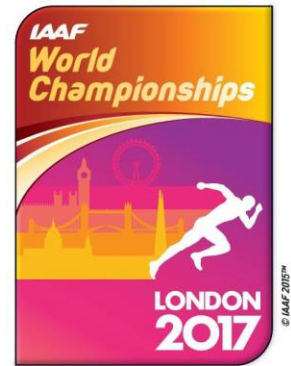


Y4 Times table Challenge

Eight more pupils know their tables in Year 4. That makes the total 55. We expect all children to know them by the time they start Year 5 in September.

On Monday 17th July 2017, Year 5 and Year 6 ventured to London's Queen Elizabeth Park for the World Para Athletics Championships; the biggest sports event in London since the Olympics in 2012.

Para athletics was one of eight sports included at the first Paralympic Games in Rome, Italy, in 1960 and has remained on the programme ever since attracting the largest number of competitors and countries. It is open to male and female athletes in all eligible impairment groups and offers a wide range of competition opportunities.



How the World Para Athletics Championships has grown:

- **Berlin 1994:** 1,154 athletes from 63 countries
- **Birmingham 1998:** 1,000 athletes from 61 countries
- **Lille 2002:** 1,000 athletes from 75 countries
- **Assen 2006:** 1,097 from 76 countries
- **Christchurch 2011:** 1,000 athletes from 80 countries
- **Lyon 2013:** 1,110 athletes from 98 countries
- **Doha 2015:** 1,229 athletes from 90 countries
- **London 2017:** 1,300 athletes from 100 countries (predicted)

The events watched included 7 finals. We were lucky enough to witness Olivia Breen, of Great Britain, claim the gold medal in the long jump. Olivia Breen was born with cerebral palsy which is a condition that affects movement and co-ordination.

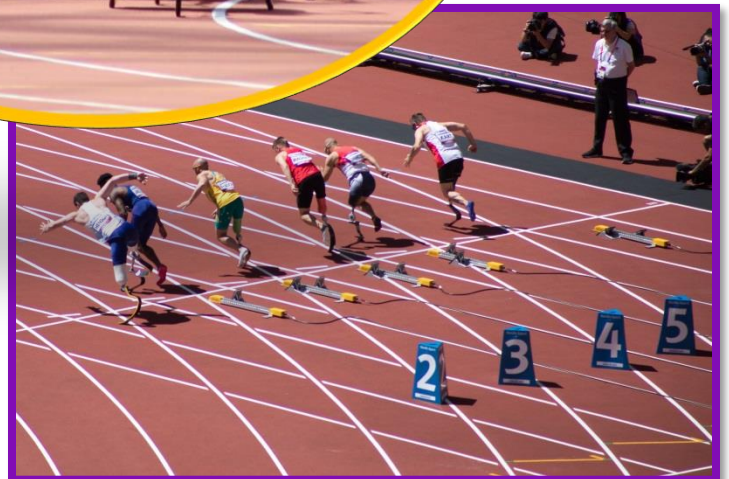


The children were also excited to meet athlete Kylie Grimes, who competes in the discus and club throw. She is paralysed from the breastbone down and explained to the children how para athletes are classified and categorised for each event. For example T 1 1 means they are competing in a track (T) event, with a visual impairment (1) and their impairment is severe (1 = most severe).
