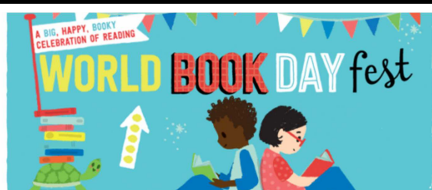

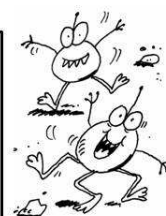

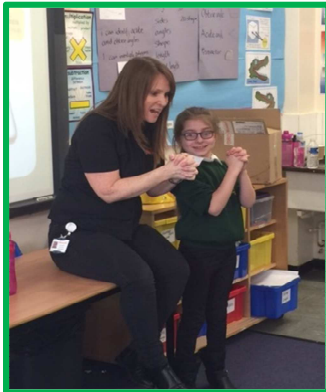

Can light go around corners?

We already knew that light only travels in straight lines. So we experimented with mirrors to see if we could reflect light successfully around a

corner. We used classroom books as our obstacle and could use as many mirrors as we needed. It was a real challenge! This photo shows the first challenge. We only needed one mirror - you can see the light reflecting brightly on Jay's face, even though he can't see the source of light (the torch). It worked!

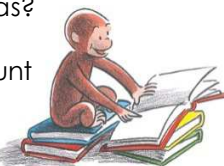
