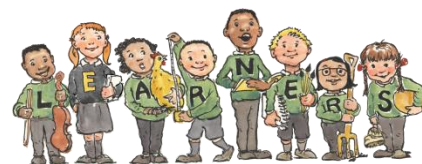

Cocktail TOMATOES

Eat well Move more Live longer

Cocktail tomatoes were introduced to the worldwide market in the 1990s. Since then, they have gained substantial popularity, due at least in part to their higher sugar content compared to regular tomatoes, and due to their smaller, bite-sized shape.

Your delivery:

- **The plant:** Grows 6–8 feet (1.8–2.4 m), and matures in 70–80 days.
- **Size:** 35-45mm.
- **Varieties used:** Aranca, Verona, Baby Mia or Tyty.
- **Storage:** Best kept between +10 and +12°C, wash gently before consumption.



Fruit of Vegetable?

Botanically speaking, tomatoes are definitely considered fruit. However, the tomato has a much lower sugar content than other edible fruits, and is therefore not as sweet. *They are a family favorite that are perfect for salads and snacks.*

DID YOU KNOW?

Tomatoes used as a food originated in Mexico, and spread throughout the world following Spanish colonization of Americas.



Nutritional information

Two cocktail tomatoes only have 18 calories and 2g of sugar.

They are low in sodium and fat and high in fiber and vitamins.

One cocktail tomato on the vine contains 17% of the daily recommended amount of vitamin C.

Health Benefits

- 1 High in Vitamin C and A to keep immune system strong.
- 2 A good source of beta-carotene for healthy vision.
