Values-based Education at Prince of Wales

Philosophers like Aristotle, Buber and Montessori were interested in children's moral education. Their ideas have formed the foundation of Values-based Education. Aristotle (384-322 BC) argued that education has two aims; to develop a child's intellect and to provide them with a moral education. These two aims also form the philosophy of Values-based Education. Aristotle believed that moral education was taught through 'active guidance by parents and teachers'. For example, parents and teachers can engage in moral and reflective discussions with the children. We can all practise positive Values around school and at home. Aristotle also believed the sole aim of a school's curriculum was the 'pursuit of happiness'...do you agree? What do you think are the aims of education? 

Behaviour Management

Dear Parents and Carers,

As part of Prince of Wales' plan to continually improve the behaviour of all children after the Easter holidays we will be introducing a few changes in how behaviour will be managed at lunch times. The following arrangements will be in place after Easter for pupils who are entered onto our behaviour log for poor behaviour, such as hitting, kicking or hurting another child:


- Children who receive 3 entries in a 4 week period escorted lunch
- Children who receive **4** entries in a 4 week period letter home and 1 week participation in a lunchtime club run by one of our learning mentors
- Children who receive **5** entries in a 4 week period parents invited to attend a meeting with a member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) to discuss behaviour of their child, who receives one week escorted lunch

We expect these occurrences to be few as behaviour across the school continues to improve.

Geography Field Studies
