Our Value for this month is Responsibility

The Value of 'Responsibility' links to the **British Values of Tolerance and Mutual Respect.** The pupils learn about the world's religions, celebrate a variety of religious festivals, and visit different places of worship. There are millions of living things on Earth. Scientists call them 'organisms'. But they need a way of telling all the living things apart. To do this they sort them into groups. This is called **classification**. It is just like the system we use to look for a book in a library. Each book has a number or code to make it easier to find. Year 6 have been exploring the classification process. We have been sorting living creatures into different groups, as well as making **classification keys**. A classification key is a sort of diagram which asks a series of questions, which can only have two answers, yes or no. We used it to sort different **vertebrates** (animals which have a backbone and a skeleton inside their body).







3N were chefs for the morning on Tuesday 26th April! They took the bus into Enfield Town and visited Pizza Express where they were taught how to make margarita pizzas.
