Dear Parents, Governors and Friends,

The end of term is approaching fast and this week has been a real rollercoaster. First we received our Year 6 SATs data and whilst trying to interpret these we were given our notification of our much anticipated OFSTED inspection.

I am unable to share the outcome of the inspection as the report will go through several stages of writing and scrutiny. This means that the report will be published during the Summer Holidays. Keep an eye on our website where we have a link to our reports and I will endeavour to notify you via school email as soon as is possible as well.

The four inspectors were keen to thank all parents who had taken the time to either text a response or complete the online questionnaire, as well as the pupils who responded. I will, as always, take note of your suggestions on how to improve our school further.

The Department for Education clearly states that this year's much tougher Year 6 Sats tests and their results cannot be compared with previous years. Last year 80% of children nationally achieved the expected for reading, writing and maths compared with 53% meeting the new expectations this year; compare this against floor target of 65% that was set by the government.

While I am delighted and relieved to report to you that our results surpassed the national averages in all areas, we didn't pass the floor target either. In September we will find out whether our progress has been sufficient.

Over the past 4 years, since I have been at Prince of Wales, we have built an experienced team that is dedicated to your children's learning. Pupils have worked harder than ever this year and their achievement by the time they reach Year 6 is phenomenal. They are a true credit to you and our school.

Much has been said about this year's testing for Reception, Year 2 and Year 6 pupils, which I won't repeat here. You may want to find out more on sites such as: https://www.tes.com/news/school-news

Due to the inspection, reports will now go out on Monday 11th July.
