
# School Garden Volunteers needed:

## **Universal Credit**

Universal Credit (UC) is a means tested benefit for working age people. It is administered by the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) and replaces the following six benefits:

- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Income Support
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Housing Benefit

#### **How does Universal Credit affect me in Enfield?**

Universal Credit live service has been available since July 2015 for single working age people to claim when they first become unemployed. This will gradually be replaced by the Universal Credit full service. If you receive Universal Credit on the live service you will be advised when to claim under the full service.

Universal Credit full service will be available in Enfield from 1 November 2017 for households with less than three children, if there is a relevant change in circumstances. For more information on these changes, visit <u>GOV.UK</u>. The roll out will be gradual and depends on what Jobcentre Plus area you live in. The timetable is as follows:

#### How will I know I need to claim Universal Credit?

If you try to claim one of the six means tested benefits Universal Credit replaces, and you are eligible, you will be advised to claim Universal Credit.

The DWP may advise you to claim Universal Credit if they are aware of a change in your current DWP benefits.

## **Getting ready for Universal Credit**

Universal Credit is administered online. You must have an account into which your payments can be made. When you receive Universal Credit, you will need to think more carefully about how you will budget your money. This is because you may have previously received one payment for your rent (your housing benefit) and a separate payment for your living costs. With Universal Credit, you will be receiving just one monthly payment and you will be responsible for paying your rent from this payment.

Find out how ready you are for Universal Credit

You can do the following to help get you ready:

- 1. Create an email account. You can find out how to do this at Learn My Way.
- 2. Register with <u>Universal Jobmatch</u>. This is the DWP's job search website, which you will need to use to search for work when you receive Universal Credit.
- 3. Set up a bank account with your local bank or building society
- 4. Start putting some money aside as there may be a time when you will need it

## **How Universal Credit is awarded**

Universal Credit normally takes around six weeks to process from the day you apply. You will be advised when and how much you will be paid in your <u>Universal Credit account</u>. If you are a tenant, you will also see how much of your payment is for housing costs. This is the amount calculated to help towards paying your rent.

When calculating Universal Credit the DWP will use the following information to work out how much Universal Credit vou will be entitled to:

- your income
- your savings and capital
- the size and makeup of your household
- vour housing costs (if you pay rent)

Universal Credit is made up of a basic 'standard allowance' and other amounts according to your circumstances. The standard allowance is the amount that is allowed in the calculation to cover all of your day-to-day living costs, including food, utilities and other essential expenses.

You may also be awarded an allowance for housing costs if you pay rent to live in your home. The amount allowed for in the calculation depends on your rent amount, the type of tenancy you have and who lives in the property with you. For further information about this, refer to GOV.UK.

#### Help with making a Universal Credit claim

If you need help making a Universal Credit claim online or managing your online account, you can visit your local Jobcentre Plus office for assistance. They have computers and staff available to help you.

If you're able to make a Universal Credit claim online and can manage the account yourself but need access to a computer and some IT support, you can visit one of our four <u>hub libraries</u>.

## Checking your Universal Credit award in your online account

When you receive your award letter in your <u>Universal Credit account</u>, you should check the details about you, your household, your income and capital and your housing costs are correct. Let the DWP know straight away if you think you have received the wrong award.

If your Universal Credit award includes housing costs to pay your rent, it may be less than the rent you're being charged. If you're struggling to make up the shortfall, you may be able to get some help from us by claiming a <u>Discretionary Housing Payment</u>.

### Changing your payment arrangements

You can ask the DWP to:

- pay your Universal Credit housing costs direct to your landlord
- split the Universal Credit payments between you and your partner
- change the frequency of your Universal Credit payments

#### **Claimant Commitment**

When you claim Universal Credit you will be asked to sign a Claimant Commitment, which means you enter an agreement to complete certain tasks to help you back into work. Claimant Commitments take your circumstances into account. Make sure that your work coach based at your job centre knows about all of your circumstances, especially if you have health problems or caring responsibilities that might mean that you are not always available for work.

It is really important that you understand what you need to do to continue to receive Universal Credit. If you do not keep to the commitment you have made, your Universal Credit payments may be stopped.

## **Advance payments**

If you have not got enough money whilst you are waiting for your first Universal Credit payment, speak to your Jobcentre Plus work coach or call the DWP's <u>Universal Credit helpline</u>.

#### If your payment is stopped or reduced

If you receive Council Tax Support, contact us and let us know what has happened. You also need to tell us how you are going to meet your day-to-day expenses whilst you are not receiving any Universal Credit. You can <u>let us know</u> that your Universal Credit payments have been stopped, or any other changes in your circumstances.

#### **Hardship payments**

You can <u>apply to the DWP</u> for a hardship payment while your Universal Credit claim is being sanctioned. Any money you receive as a hardship payment must be paid back from your future Universal Credit payments.

## Appealing a decision

If you disagree with the amount that you have been awarded or with a decision to reduce or stop your Universal Credit, you can ask the DWP to look at their decision again.

#### Budgeting

If you are experiencing problems managing your money, you should seek advice. Rent and Council Tax are priority debts and it is important that you make sure they are paid. These organisations can provide money advice:

## **Housing rent payments**

If your tenancy is managed by Enfield Council and you start to receive Universal Credit, your housing costs will be included in your Universal Credit payment. You will need to pay all the rent you are charged out of this payment. If you're experiencing difficulties in paying your rent, contact us and we will do our best to help you.
