MWW - Supporting Healthy Eating in Primary Schools...

Penns Primary School

On 28th March the MWW healthy eating team visited Penns Primary School in Sutton Coldfield for a fruit and vegetable tasting session. We were very grateful to be given the chance to visit such a lovely school. During the day we saw nearly 90 Key Stage 1 children in 3 different lessons.

The first tasting session was with year 1. They tried blueberries, sweet-bite peppers, tomatoes, physallis and sugar snaps. After morning break we met Year 2, who tried blueberries, broccoli, nectarines, physallis and mini cucumbers. Finally, after lunch, the reception class tasted physallis, sugar snaps, blueberries and apples.

We really enjoyed the opportunity to work with the children. The children impressed us all with their willingness to try new products and their knowledge of healthy eating.

What the Children Said

The children's knowledge was shown in their comments: "Vegetables make you big and strong"; "Fruit helps you grow"; "Broccoli gives me vitamin K. It is yummy". They impressed with their ability to match the health benefits with particular vegetables.

The children gave us some excellent feedback on the produce, with one pupil calling physallis "the lollipop fruit" and another comparing them to kiwi.

What Was the Outcome?


Overall, we found that the mini cucumbers were the most popular, with all the children who tried them saying that they liked them, closely followed by blueberries, with 69 of the 76 children who tried them saying that they liked them.

There were many benefits from the visit. We aimed to give the children an enjoyable lesson where they were able to try out new tastes and to support the schools in the good the work they are doing to encourage healthy eating. We are also hoping to support the government's Change for Life initiative.

From our point of view, the visit helped us to understand the challenges that the school faces in distributing the fruit and vegetables, such as how easy or otherwise it is to fit into the school day. We are also able to speak to the schools and find out how we can improve our service.
