Consultation regarding changes to the School Day

Thank you to all who participated in the survey. Out of a total of 108 responses, 65 were from parents. That is by no means everyone and the assumption can be made that those that didn't respond are happy with the proposal. That said, the greatest concern expressed relates to the morning break time. We are therefore offering a second option: to keep the current morning break and start 10 minutes earlier. Year 5 and 6 doors would open at 8.30am and lessons start at 8.40am. Years 3 and 4 start 5 minutes after this. Similarly, Years 1 and 2 and Reception doors would open at 8:45 and lessons start at 9.00am. School gates would open at 8:20am and offer additional flexibility for some working parents.

I like the Hypocaust with the mosaic tiles. Connor

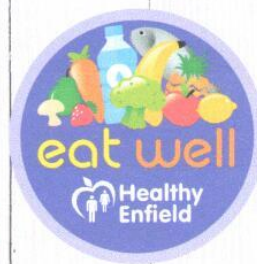




Join us in celebrating
