Consultation regarding changes to the School Day

Thank you to all who participated in the survey. Out of a total of 108 responses, 65 were from parents. That is by no means everyone and the assumption can be made that those that didn't respond are happy with the proposal. That said, the greatest concern expressed relates to the morning break time. We are therefore offering a second option: to keep the current morning break and start 10 minutes earlier. Year 5 and 6 doors would open at 8.30am and lessons start at 8.40am. Years 3 and 4 start 5 minutes after this, Similarly, Years 1 and 2 and Reception doors would open at 8:45 and lessons start at 9.00am. Year 4 visited the Roman Verulamium this week and enjoyed seeing the Hypocaust (mosaic floor with under floor heating) and handling Roman artefacts.


My favourite part was holding Roman artefacts that the archaeologists had found. Anshika

Instagram is an image and video sharing app that allows users to share moments with the world. The app has a live streaming feature and additional add-ons, such as 'Boomerang,' 'Hyperlapse' and 'Layout', which can be used to enhance their

feed. Users can choose to add filters and make adjustments to their photos, such as brightness/ contrast. To make their content more 'searchable', users can include hashtags in their uploads to make them easier to find.

IN-APP PAYMENTS

Instagram is rolling out in-app payments for products and services directly through he app. It will operate under the same rules as Facebook Payments, which state if you are under the age of 18, you can only use acebook Payments with the involvement of a parent or guardian.

REMOVE PAYMENT METHODS

If you are happy for your child to have a card associated with their Instagram account, we suggest adding a PIN which needs to be entered before making a payment; this will also help prevent unauthorized purchases. This can be added in the payment settings tab.

RESTRICT MESSAGES

If your child's account is not private, anybody can message them and reply to their stories. If they do wish to keep their account public, we strongly recommend changing the message reply settings to restrict who can message them.

NEW FOR MAY 2018

FILTER INAPROPRIATE COMMENTS

Instagram announced on 1st May that they now have an 'anti-bullying' filter on the app. The new filter hides comments containing attacks on a person's appearance or character, as well as threats to a person's well-being or health. The filter will also alert Instagram to repeated problems so they can take action on the user if necessary. This is an automatic filter. necessary. This is an automatic filter, but it can be turned off. Make sure this is turned on in the apps settings.



TURN OFF SHARING

Even though this feature will not stop people from taking screenshots, it will stop others being able to directly share photos and videos from a story as a message to another user. This feature can be turned off in the settings. We also recommend turning off the feature which automatically shares photos and videos from a story to a Facebook account.

USE A PRIVATE ACCOUNT

By default, any image or video your child uploads to Instagram is visible to anyone. A private account means that you have to approve a request if somebody wants to follow you and only people you approve will see your posts and videos.
