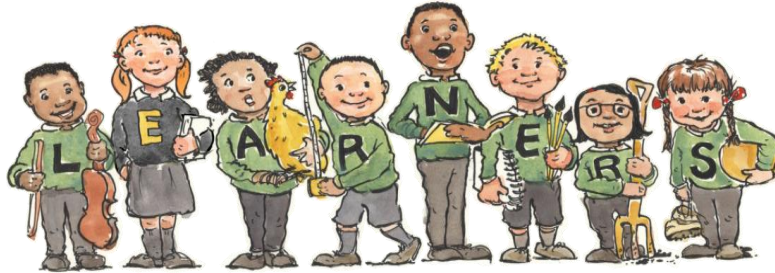

Dear Parents,

Last year we launched a new maths homework initiative called Ocean maths. We are pleased to say that we will continue with Ocean Maths again this year.

Every 2 weeks your child's maths homework will be an exciting game to play.

This will be a pamphlet that will be sent home instead of any other Maths homework. The activities are mainly game based and will be explained in class before they are sent home.

If your child was in Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5 last year they will have their packs at home. Only if your child is new to our school will they be provided with a free pack.

Year 1 will receive their new packs at the Ocean maths parent session on the 11th October.

It has cost the school nearly £800 to provide everyone with a free pack.

We kindly ask that you replace any items yourselves so the children can continue to have fun, game-based maths learning at home which is a wonderful alternative to the normal worksheet.

This half-term every class from year 1-6 will have an Ocean Maths parent session. Once again, you are invited to join your child for a special Maths session in their classroom. This will be a chance to find out a little bit about how we teach Maths and to take part alongside your child. Your child will bring home an invitation, don't forget to return the reply slip so we can add extra chairs!

There are lots of games to play and help on hand; it won't be like your childhood memories of Maths lessons. We promise not to put you on the spot and won't ask you to chant your times tables!

We also ask that younger brothers or sisters do not attend so the children and adults can focus on the games.

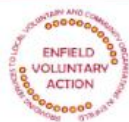

Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) Christmas Tree Project 2018

Metropolitan Police Service's annual Poster Competition promotes the Commissioner's Christmas Tree Project.

The Christmas Tree Project began with one tree outside New Scotland Yard in Westminster. This tree was decorated with individual tags which gave information on how to buy a present for a child in care. These presents were then handed in to Police Officers, who would distribute them to children.

In the last four years, this Project has taken place across London, with each of the 32 Boroughs putting up a tree with tags on. The response from our people and public has been simply overwhelming. In 2017 the Project exceeded expectations with 19,133 presents delivered to children across London. Many officers described this as some of the most rewarding work they had done during their service, as the impact of uniformed police officers spending time with children managed to bring some cheer.

To advertise this Project, every year we have a poster with a picture designed by a Primary School child. This year, every Borough's Senior Leadership Team will pick a winner, whose picture will be made into a poster and will be used throughout the Project on your Borough. All Borough winners along with their families, will be invited to New Scotland Yard to watch The Commissioner switch on the lights to the main Christmas Tree and also to the Metropolitan Police Christmas Carol service at Westminster Abbey.

The Commissioner and the overall poster designed winner will switch on the Christmas Tree lights.
