- To improve parental engagement in EYFS
- Lilac trained staff to share strategies to support advanced bi-lingual learners
- To improve the whole school approach to the teaching of handwriting and spelling
- To participate in cross school moderations
- To motivate learners through learning outdoors
- To increase parental involvement in pupils' learning (incl. Cafes 4 All)
- To support teachers to improve the quality of PE lessons.
- To improve teachers' confidence in the delivery of music
- Trial International Dyslexia Learning (IDL) – reading and spelling computer program

Key Action 2 Introduce end of school day 2.30pm – 3.30pm enrichment

- Ensure smooth transition at the start and end of each session.
- Ensure school budget not adversely affected by enrichment
- Review procedures for pupils sign up and arranging groups in time for Spring, Summer and Autumn '19 activities.
- Review impact of the new school day and enrichment on staff and pupils

Key Action 3 Reduce persistent absence and exclusions

- To improve the emotional well-being of pupils and create closer links with parents / carers (incl Sandwell Charter Mark)
- Communicate more regularly with parents
