Year 5 - Transport for London

On Tuesday 19th March the Year 5 children enjoyed a one hour workshop delivered by Transport for London. The children learnt about the different ways to get around London and how there is a bigger push for people to take public transport to ease congestion and reduce the impact on the environment.

It was a hands on session with lots of activities to engage the children. These included building human bar charts, estimating peak times on the tubes, underground map reading and simulating different modes of transport around London. TfL shared some of the latest technology from Oyster cards to estimating pedestrian numbers. It was a fun and informative session that the children and staff all enjoyed.
