activity	description
African Drumming	Enjoy the rhythms and dance moves of Ghana.
Art	Your children learn to express feelings, with or without words, developing their hand and eye coordination. Art can be fun and challenging once you find the creativity it offers and all aspects of cultural resources.
Art & Craft	There is no right or wrong when it comes to MAKING ART & CRAFTs, making sure that you have FUN is the important part, SO children let's get creating and messy!
Art History	Discover and explore the history through art in fun sessions, starting in Mesopotamia and all the way to modern art
Athletics	Who better to lead athletics skills than an actual GB athlete?
Backgammon	Did you know that backgammon is one of the oldest known board games? Its history can be traced back nearly 5,000 years to archaeological discoveries in the Middle East. It is easy to pick up but takes a lifetime to master.. It is a game of strategy, statistics, logical thinking and suspense.
Ball games	Take control of the ball and improve your coordination through catching, throwing, kicking on your own and in teams.
Book Club	For enthusiastic readers, an opportunity to really explore books and learn about their authors. We will discuss books in depth sharing what we liked and disliked about the books -
Calligraphy	Calligraphy is a visual art related to writing. Come and learn the techniques and skills to create this beautiful writing.
Chess	Learn to play this fantastic game of strategy that is played all over the world.
Computing	<p>Computing enrichment activity aims to introduce coding to pupils.</p> <p>Please note that Computing enrichment <i>is not</i> an Internet Café where pupils can come and play games or watch videos. It is an intense brain activity that requires commitment. Pupils are expected to participate in the lessons, focus longer than they are usually accustomed to.</p> <p>Every pupil is interested in internet or computers. However, we would advise against choosing Computing Enrichment if your child is not particularly interested in <u>coding</u>.</p> <p>We introduce block coding to years 1,2 and 3. Block Coding is a visual design language to make items or pictures on the screen move around. It is not a programming language. It aims to teach concept of coding.</p>

	<p>We aim to combine this knowledge with real life hardware devices towards to end of the term and have pupils to control simple hardware specifically designed for block programming.</p> <p>We teach HTML in years 4, 5 and 6. HTML is language used to write web sites. We start with basic hand crafted HTML. Later on we move to intermediate HTML where pupils learn to use a specific program to write their HTML code and build a simple website.</p>
Construction club	Bring your ideas to life by building your own models using blocks Duplo and Lego.
Curious Maths Y6	By invitation only. <b>Payment directly to tutor.</b>
Drama	Learning fundamental skills to increase self-esteem/confidence, listening, negotiating and communicating. Assisting children to access their emotions, along with understanding different ways to express them through role-play.
Drawing and Colouring	A free choice of drawing and colouring activities.
D&T	It's not just about the ideas, it's about making ideas happen. Use your imagination and using a range of materials and techniques and create a design with a purpose.
Fame Allstars Gymnastics	Very popular. coaching in cheerleading, tumbling, gymnastics. <b>Payment goes directly to the coach.</b>
Film Club	You are invited to come and watch a diverse range of films including classics, black and white movies, blockbusters and many more in a relaxing environment.
First Aid Training	Using a variety of lessons and learning materials such as online activities and role play scenarios, your child will learn a range of first aid skills, which will help them to deal with a number of situations. We will also send home information where you can look online and support your child to become confident in first aid situations.
French	Parlez-vous francais? So, why french? Think of as many reasons you can why you should learn French. Jot them down. Then, join the club.
Gardening	The children will work with the gardeners on projects relevant to the time of year. This will include, planting, weeding, harvesting, watering and tidying. They will learn basic gardening skills as well as gaining a greater understanding of the natural world. You will notice some of the gardening clubs work around the school, such as the hanging baskets at the front of the school building and along the side of the nursery.
Gymnastics	Develop strength, flexibility, agility, coordination, balance and control through gymnastics.
Homework	Offers a place for your child to work in a learning and supportive environment. Encouraging them to work with others or independently making homework seem more achievable and not a chore.
Knitting	Learning basic knitting skills whilst further developing your child's fine motor skills and concentration, building your child's resilience giving them a sense of achievement when they finish their final product.
Kurling - New Age	There is a new sport at the Prince of Wales...Kurling.

	The aim of the game is to push stones on wheels towards a target to score points. Some of our Year 4 pupils won a tournament in February 2019 and went through to the National games representing Enfield Borough. This is a great game to try.
Lego club	Your child can enjoy a calm, relaxing, therapeutic, multi-sensory, open –ended experience when building with Lego bricks. Lego helps children to develop many skills: concentration, following instructions, turn taking , sharing , communication , working together and using their imagination to create their own special Lego models and to have fun.
Library	Enjoy reading books. Listen to stories and have fun with literacy activities.
Magic	Learn card and other tricks to wow your friends and family; just don't tell them how you did it!
Makaton	Learn how to sing & sign, to support communication in many different ways
Maths games	Fun logic and reasoning games that will develop your child's problem solving skills in an exciting and engaging environment.
Mix It up	A fun packed enrichment. Word Search/Spot the difference/Odd one out and Tongue Twisters. Let your eyes scan for differences between pictures. How many times can you repeat a tongue twister before saying different words? Which word or picture is the odd one out? Or we may sing some songs.
Movie	Watch movies in a calm and relaxing environment, spending time with friends.
netball	Open to everyone, boys and girls all abilities.
Netball- invitation	For advanced netball players.
Ocarina	Children will have fun learning to play a new musical instrument. And develop early musical notation skills.
Phonics	Phonics are key to reading, so come along, play some phonic games and grow into a confident reader.
Phonics and Word Games	Come along and have fun playing games to practice your phonic skills, reading and spelling. Be an even better reader/speller!
Playdough	Join in the fun, chop, poke, roll, pinch and squash playdough whilst making models. Helping develop children's manipulative skills needed for writing. <b>Charge: £1</b> per child for each half term to cover for flour, salt, oil, food colourings and containers to keep it in. Plus, any smells or glitters to make the playdough different senses.
Puzzles	Work out a strategy, sort and find the pieces and watch the image appear. A great relaxing activity to do with friends whilst chatting.
Reading	It's great to read. It helps to improve your writing skills and understanding of words. Choose a book from the library and read with a member of staff.
Recorders Y4 - invitation	Enjoy making music together by continuing your recorder practice and further improve your musical skills.
Saz	For those learning to play the saz – payment directly to the tutor.

Sewing	Come and learn how to sew, make things, and have fun. Any day spent sewing is a good day, let's be creative...
Skipping	This popular activity continues. You will be amazed at how your coordination, stamina and well-being improves as a result of jumping to the beat.
Spag Y6 - invitation	Do you need some extra help with your fronted adverbials and can't tell your present progressive from your past progressive? This could be the enrichment for you. Once SAT's are over let's focus on writing. Writing is a very powerful tool and it can help you to make a difference in your life. It can also bring some pleasant surprises.....
Spanish	Come and learn Spanish; have fun leaning songs and using Spanish in a practical way.
Speed stacking	A fast fun activity to help develop hand eye coordination and motor skills working individually, in pairs or teams. Come and see how you stack up.
