We were very proud of our year three pupils who represented themselves and our school incredibly well.

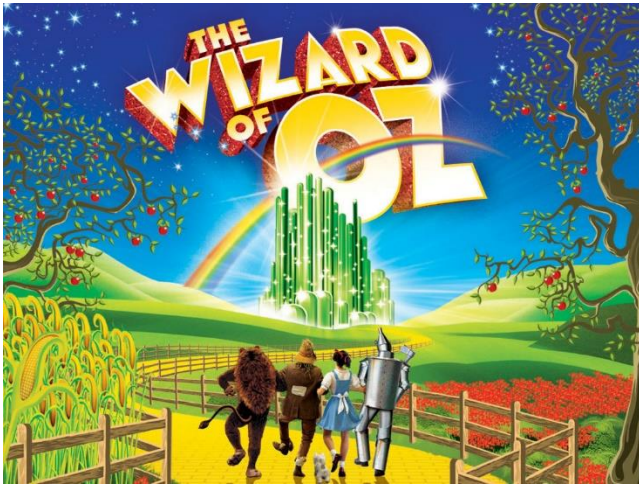
Sajoyah - My favourite part of the day was singing to the other primary schools.
