Summary of Parent Forum on 12th June

Around 40 parents were in attendance, as well as 3 Governors. The main item discussed were changes to the school day from September 2019.

Mr Bless explained why this trial year of enrichment could unfortunately not be maintained into the next term. Although enrichment had proven to be very popular, it was precisely the high take up of around 80% of all pupils throughout the year that proved ultimately also very challenging. Whilst acknowledging the many benefits, the barriers to staff being able to undertake their core duties due to the additional workload of managing enrichment proved an overriding reason for most staff to ask for this to be discontinued. We can look proudly back at great experiences for our pupils, most who benefitted from 190 days of engaging and diverse activities.

Mr Bless explained that the new school day would likely start at 8:40am and end at 3:20pm for KS1 and KS2, with slightly later starts and earlier finishing times for Nursery and Reception. Following discussion with representatives from the National Education Union on Wednesday, these times were favourably received. The final proposal will be put to staff and then to Governors to ratify the new school day on Thursday 27^h June. We will then confirm this with parents on Friday 28th June.

Parent Questions:

- Parking will be an issue again if we go back to 8:40 start times again.
 Parking has unfortunately continued to be an issue, similar to all other schools in Enfield
- Fly tipping in the school road becoming a huge issue for parents walking to school.
 Parents advised to form a group to write to councils about these issues.
 - Enfield library will be holding a ward forum for local community next week, regarding complaints about the above issues.
- What are the legal hours for a teacher?
 - Teachers are directed to work 1265 hours per year. The proposed contracted day is 8:30-3:30 but teachers do much more before and after these hours, to fulfil the myriad of jobs such as marking books, preparing lessons, assessing work, attending training, organising classes and display and much, much more.
- What is the proposed day?
 - The proposal is for doors to open 8:40am for children to enter the building and finish at 3:20pm. Times will vary for EYFS to allow parents to drop off and collect.

Headteacher remit is to consider the needs of the local community to teach the full curriculum. The day would be 10 minutes longer and finish later to account for: 1) Enfield Lock trains that arrive at 3:04pm and give working parents time to walk to school; 2) we introduced the Daily Mile walk/run; 3) there are greater expectations from OFSTED for schools to teach the full curriculum; 4) many of our pupils need more time to access the curriculum.

Lunchtime increased to an hour.

- Some parents preferred the 3:30pm finish due to work times; some have changed hours to fit in with present school day and bus schedule makes getting to school before 3:30pm impossible.
 - The NEU would advise teachers that this is not acceptable.
- Will afterschool club provide the service to coincide with school finish time? yes
- Will Breakfast Club remain open from 7:30am? yes
- School finishes now at 2:30 will there be additional learning time now? explained that children have the same amount of learning time as before. The new proposal is to make the day 10 minutes longer due to the mile run, train schedule and meeting the needs of all the children and the curriculum.
- Will there be lunchtime clubs and afterschool clubs with new school day? yes
- When will you be communicating with parents about the new day? After the Governors ratify the new school day on 27th June, we will inform parents the following day.


