



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WHAT IS THE COMMUNITY HELP POINT SCHEME?

CHiPS has been a network of 'safe havens' across the Borough of Enfield since 2006, where young & vulnerable people who are lost, at risk or feeling vulnerable can go in and ask for help & assistance from the community.

WHAT DO MEMBERS HAVE TO DO?

Members display the CHiPS logo & can make a phone call to get assistance for someone, allow someone to sit in safety for a while until a risk has passed, give someone directions on how to get to their chosen destination, call the police, medical or social care teams.

WHO ARE CURRENTLY MEMBERS?

We have around 200 chips points across the borough – these include schools, leisure centres, libraries & a network of shops as well as other street-front businesses. You can find a map of all current CHiPS locations on facebook & havesomechips.com

MMR Immunisation –Measles Mumps and Rubella

You may have seen in the news recently that there have been quite large outbreaks of measles in some of our neighbouring boroughs, particularly in Barnet, Haringey and Hackney.

Outbreaks of this kind are becoming increasingly common and are occurring more widely and more often across London, with children, young people and some young parents being those most affected. This is because many children may have missed receiving their MMR vaccinations.

These outbreaks are a serious concern with up to a million children and young teenagers potentially vulnerable to serious infection, especially as children of this age are going into secondary school where the spread of infection is much more likely to happen.

Whilst measles, mumps and rubella (German measles) are very unpleasant illnesses, they also increase the risk of longer term and more severe health problems, particularly during pregnancy. The complications of measles can include pneumonia, hearing loss and the inflammation of the brain.

MMR vaccine is **free and available from your GP** (please take along the red book), and school-age children can access Community Immunisation Drop-in at St Michaels Hospital Site on certain days (please see last page).

We also include an information leaflet to answer some common questions about measles and the vaccine.





We also spotted dragonflies, butterflies and damselflies. All clear signs of how the area is developing and maturing.
