

### **ELECTION OF PARENTS TO THE SCHOOL'S GOVERNING BODY**

The Governing Body of the School currently has a vacancy for a Parent Governor.

I am writing to invite nominations of parents interested in standing for election to fil this vacancy. Every parent of a registered pupil at the School is entitled to stand for election except someone who is

- an elected member of the Council;
- paid to work at the School for more than 500 hours in a 12 month period.

If you wish to stand for election could you please let me know in writing by Wednesday 6th November 2019.

If the number of candidates is greater than the number of parent governor vacancies then a ballot will be necessary. In this instance you will be sent details of the candidates and a ballot paper on which to record your *vote/s*. Should a ballot be necessary, the candidate may if s/he wishes write a brief description of themselves, in not more than 200 words, for circulation with the ballot papers.

All prospective candidates should contact the School to request the 'Declaration of Eligibility Form' which they should read, sign and return to the School to state that none of the information applies to them.

Depending on Governing Body agreed arrangements the successful candidate may be required to have a DBS check. As this position is exempt from The Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 you will be required to declare all unspent and spent cautions and criminal offences, including any pending convictions. The disclosure of a criminal record or other information will not necessarily debar you from volunteering as a governor. This will depend on the nature of the position and the circumstances, nature and background of your offence(s).

Parent Governors have an important role to play in representing parents' views on the Governing Body. I hope that you will take advantage of this opportunity to become involved in the School.

If your child is in year 6 and you are considering a maths tutor please read the flyer attached. The next club begins this Thursday and will focus on Fractions. I will be teaching the programme.





### ERASMUS VISIT TO PERPIGNAN, FRANCE

We successfully applied for EU funding earlier this year for two separate projects.

One was to improve the language competences of our staff and pupils and enhance their learning experiences. We believe that learning another language gives children a new and broader perspective on the world, encouraging them to understand their own cultures and those of others, which feeds into our focus on global learning. Over the October half term, four staff (two teachers and two HLTAs) from our school, together with staff from two other Enfield schools, travelled to Perpignan, France for a structured training course. The main focus of the course was to build participants' confidence in using French through immersion and practice. The training course has been a fantastic opportunity for our staff to acquire new skills and increase their confidence in the use of French. There were different opportunities for participants to immerse in the language in various situations throughout each day. As a result of this mobility, staff is keen to share the new gained skills and knowledge and integrate them effectively into the everyday scheduled activities of our school.

In our Friday Achievement assembly, pupils from 2A demonstrated their ability to greet, count and ask questions in French:

Salut
Bonjour mes amis.
Comment t'appeles tu?
Je m'appelle [nom].
Comment ça va?
Ça va bien, merci.
Counting to 10.

All with immaculate French pronunciation.

The whole school then counted in twos in French as well. This was inspired by Mr Bless' visit to De Driemaster School in the Netherlands, where a class of pupils new to the country were learning to count in evens in Dutch.

### ERASMUS VISIT TO THE HAGUE, THE NETHERLANDS

Together with our partner school De Driemaster we aim to improve the learning outcomes of our pupils. We do this over a two-year project by focussing on increasing pupils' vocabulary and reading, increasing parents' engagement in their child's learning, sharing good pedagogy and outdoor learning. Mr Bless, Miss Clarke and Miss Houadef attended training (in Dutch), observed lessons and explored the area in and around Voorburg. De Driemaster pupils come from a wide range of backgrounds, just as ours. In one class we counted 22 different languages that they were exposed to at home.







# **Managing Children's Behaviour**
