- ADJECTIVES - You are free to choose! Year 3


- The book "THE ICE PALACE" Year 4 Year 5 - The book "HIGHWAY MAN"

Our partner school De Driemaster from The Hague in The Netherlands visited us on Monday and Tuesday this week.


The fourteen teachers came specially to learn about Parent Cafés, outdoor learning and our strategies to narrowing the vocabulary gap.

In turn, our teachers learnt more about their Teach Like a Champion teaching techniques that are used at De Driemaster.

Our visitors were very complimentary about the hard work that goes into planning and teaching our PoW curriculum and they left with enthusiasm to try out some of the great examples they saw modelled.


In the May half term break some of our teachers will return to The Netherlands to continue our joint project and other will travel to Paris to strengthen our provision for teaching French.

Adrian 1T shared his English book. Here he answered questions about a picture using the word 'because'. Demitri 6B brought his Geography work to assembly. He talked about his research into the impact of human presence on the Antarctic. He impressed the audience when drawing links with the demise of the Dodo on Mauritius that he found out about in guided reading. He also explained how humans leave contaminated soil and this led to Year 6 pupils reflecting on our local studies project about Island Village and the need to cap the soil in this area against buried chemicals that were left after the Small Arms factory closed and a large housing estate was built.

Advice on the coronavirus for places of education

How serious is the coronavirus?

- it can cause flu-like symptoms, including fever, cough & difficulty breathing
- the infection is not serious for most people, including children
- there is currently no vaccine
- · most people get better with enough rest, water to drink and medicine for pain

How likely are you to catch the virus?

- · you can only catch it if you have been close to a person who has the virus
- . the chance of being in contact with the virus is currently low in the UK
- if you have travelled to areas where many people are infected, your chance of catching the virus is higher, i.e. China and any affected areas

What should you do if you feel unwell?

Keep away from others and stay at home to stop the infection spreading. Avoid public transport if you think you have symptoms of coronavirus. If you become unwell at a place of education, tell a member of staff and let them know if you have travelled to any other countries in the last 14 days.

If your staff member or parent thinks you have symptoms of coronavirus, they should call NHS 111 for advice. Follow the UK Government advice for childcare or educational settings gov.uk/government/publications/guidance-to-educational-settings-about-covid-19. Parents can visit NHS.UK to find out more information. Teachers and support staff should follow the UK Government advice.

Staff, students and pupils who have returned from Wuhan and Hubei Province in China should self isolate, and NOT attend education or work for 14 days. See NHS.UK for advice on coronavirus.

If there is an emergency, call 999 immediately

People who have returned from Category 1 specified countries/areas in the last 14 days should self-isolate. This includes avoiding attending an education setting or work until 14 days after they return.

People who have returned from Category 2 specified countries/areas in the last 14 days, are advised to stay at home if they develop symptoms. All other pupils or students and staff should continue to attend school or university, including their siblings attending the same or a different school (unless advised not to by public health officials).



World Book Day


On Thursday 5th March NURSERY are celebrating
