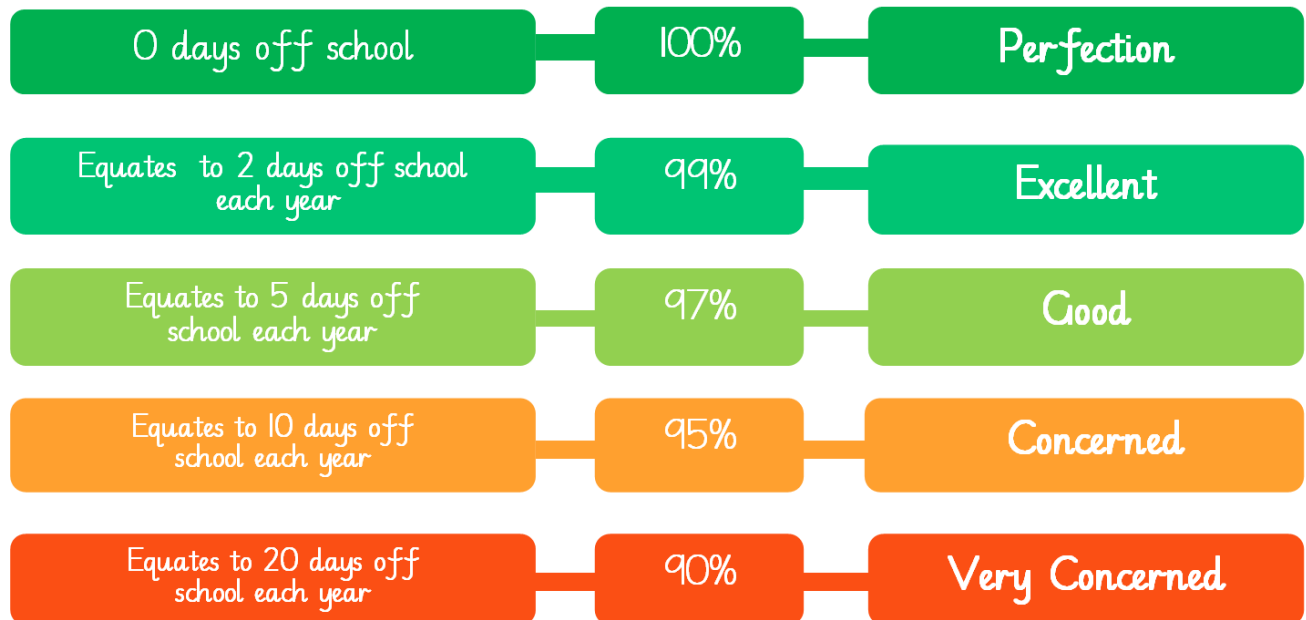

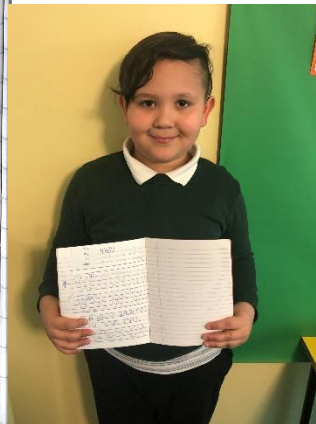

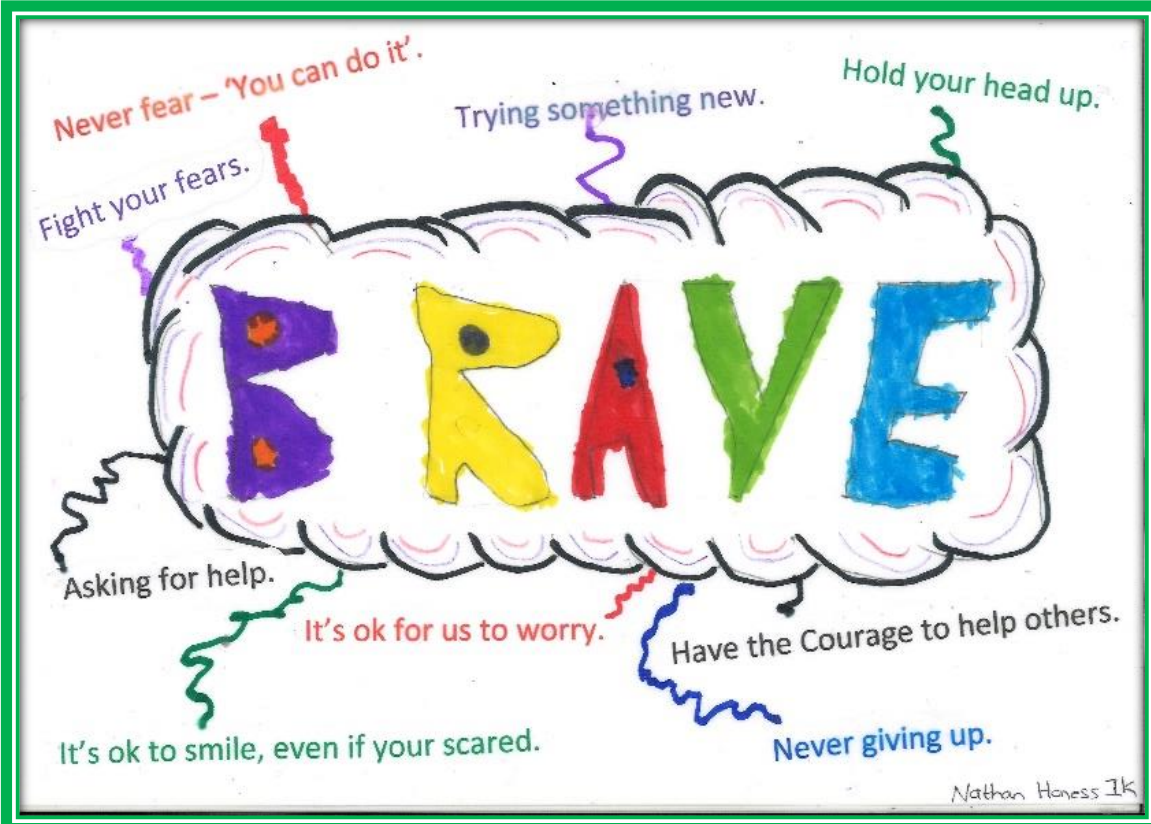
Brilliant Book
