The children will be taking part in skipping activities on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> March.



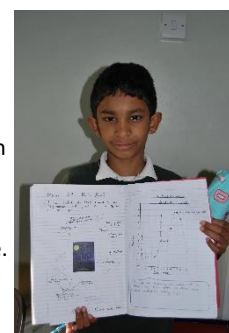
Learning together, growing together

Each holiday, Year 6 pupils are invited to attend English and Maths catch-up classes.

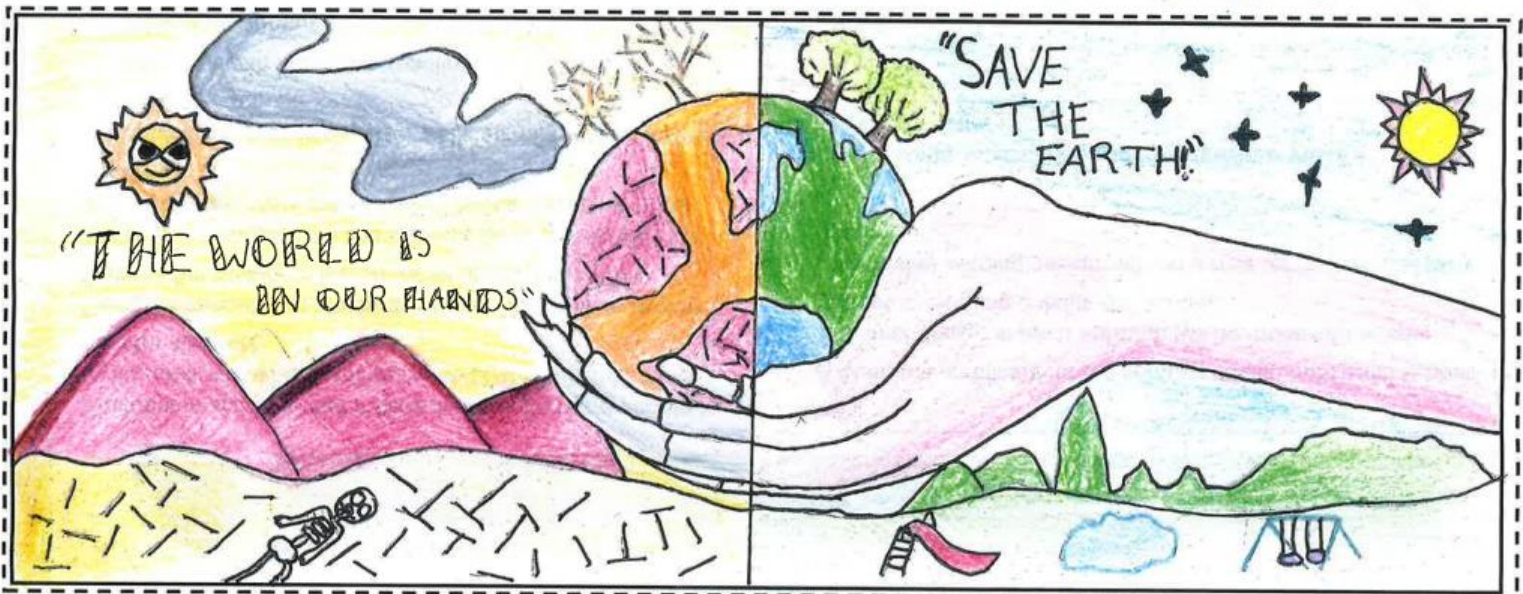
