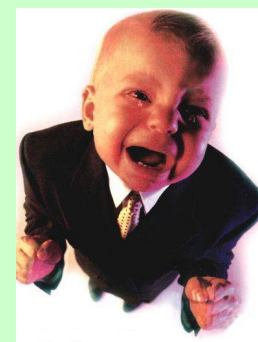

In your books, make a list of **unfair** treatment in the world and a list of **fair** treatment. These can include situations where people have less access to resources compared to others.

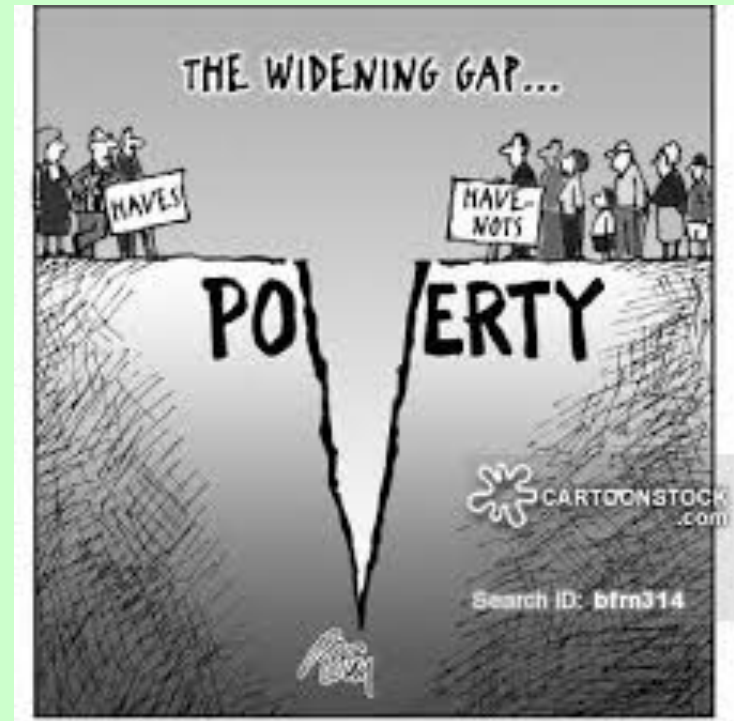
Which of the lists is longer?

Social Injustice

Social injustice is a term used to describe situations where some people in society are given fewer rights and privileges than others.



Christian Teachings

Christians believe in the value and dignity of all human beings.

- This includes the weak, immigrants and other minority groups in society.

Liberation theology is the Christian idea that God has the power to change situations in the world that are unjust.
