The night of power is when Allah revealed the Qur'an to the prophet Muhammad (PBUH). PBUH stands for 'peace be upon him' which is a complimentary phrase attached to the names of the prophets in Islam. It is an important event for Muslims all over the world. It is also known as 'Lailat al Qadr'.

The Night of Power took place more than 1400 years ago in 610 C.E. Prophet Muhammad lived in a city called Makkah (now often called Mecca) in the middle of the Arabian desert. Makkah was a frightening place to live. There was gambling, fights and hatred. In the middle of Mecca was the Kaaba ('the cube') which had been built for worship. Originally, it was filled with 360 different idols and these were worshipped by the people. People argued over which idol was the real one or the best. Muhammad believed that none of them deserved to be worshipped.

Muhammad did not like the way people behaved in Mecca. It made him very unhappy. He would walk up into the mountains and find a cave to sit in and find peace. He spent a long time in the caves, meditating and thinking.

It was the month of Ramadan and there were celebrations around the Ka'bah. People made sacrifices to the idols. Muhammad didn't like this and went up to the cave. He believed in one God (just like Jews and Christians).


On one of the nights in the cave, Muhammad was praying to his God, known as Allah. Angel Jibril (Angel Gabriel) appeared in front of him. The angel told him to read from a scroll, but he couldn't. The angel asked him to read from a scroll, but he couldn't read. The angel asked him again but again Muhammad could not read. Angel Jibril asked a third time and suddenly Muhammad was able to read. Muhammad read the message out loud. It was a message from Allah. This meant that Muhammad was a prophet, chosen to receive the messages and tell them to the people. Muhammad kept getting messages from Allah throughout his life. The words were written down by Muhammad's friends. These messages eventually became the Qu'ran, the Muslim holy book. The night of Power it believed to fall during the last 10 days of Ramadan.





What do you know about Ramadan?

Ramadan is a period of ritual fasting. It marks the time when the Quran (their holy book) was revealed to the Prophet Muhammad. During Ramadan, most Muslims fast.

Do you know what **fasting** means?

This means they are not allowed to eat or drink during daylight hours. When fasting, they feel hungry and thirsty, which reminds Muslims of people in the world who are less fortunate than themselves.

They begin to understand what it must be like for people who don't have much to eat and because of this, many give money to the poor. Muslims will often have a meal called **suhoor** before sunrise and another called **iftar** after sunset.
