

Discuss with your adult different things you see. 4. Write sentences about the things you see. If you need to use the sentence starters: The kitchen has... I can see... There is... 5. Challenge: Use 'and' to join two sentences.
Science	I can identify the roots of different kinds of plants.	1. Google: Plants KS1 Science BBC Bitesize 2. Scroll down and watch: What are the parts of a plant? 3. Optional: Scroll down and do the quiz – What are the parts of a plant? 4. Optional: Discuss with an adult and write the answers in your work book.
