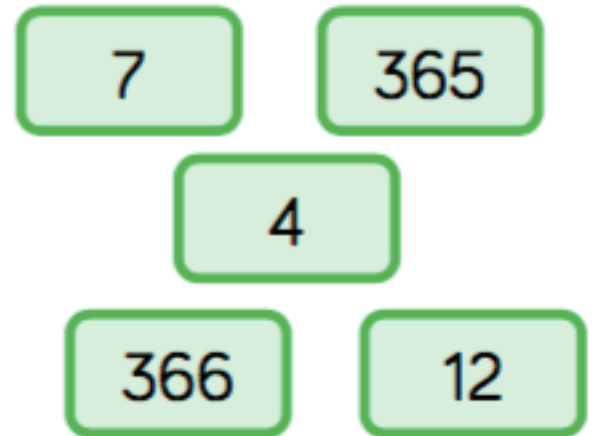
This week we are starting work on time.
