A paramedic can be a man or a woman. Their job is to help sick or injured people. When someone is sick or injured, a paramedic may be called to take them to the hospital. A paramedic may also be called if someone has broken their leg, been in a car accident, had an allergic reaction or had an asthma attack. It does not matter what time of day or night when an emergency happens, you can dial '999' at any time. Paramedics are important in our community. They are so important that they need to work every day of the year, just in case of emergencies.

Calling '999' should only be done if there is an emergency. If you call this number as a joke, you can get into trouble. We need to keep the telephone line clear for actual emergencies as the paramedics are there to save lives. When a paramedic needs to get to a certain place, they turn on their lights and sirens. This is so people on the road around them know that they are in a hurry to get to someone who is sick or injured. When you see the lights flashing and you hear the sirens, this means you need to leave enough space for the ambulance to pass by.

Paramedics carry lots of special equipment. This equipment helps them to save lives. Some of the important equipment that they carry are special drugs and medicines, bandages, oxygen bottles and heart monitors. They also carry radios and walkie-talkies. These help them stay in touch with other paramedics. Paramedics have a vital job in our community.


