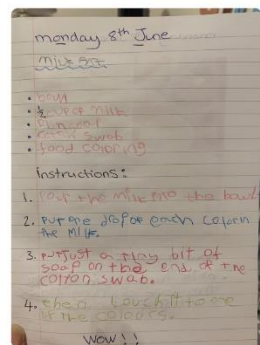

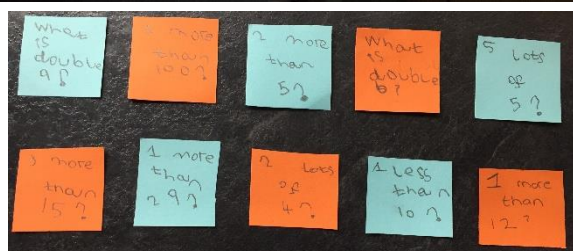
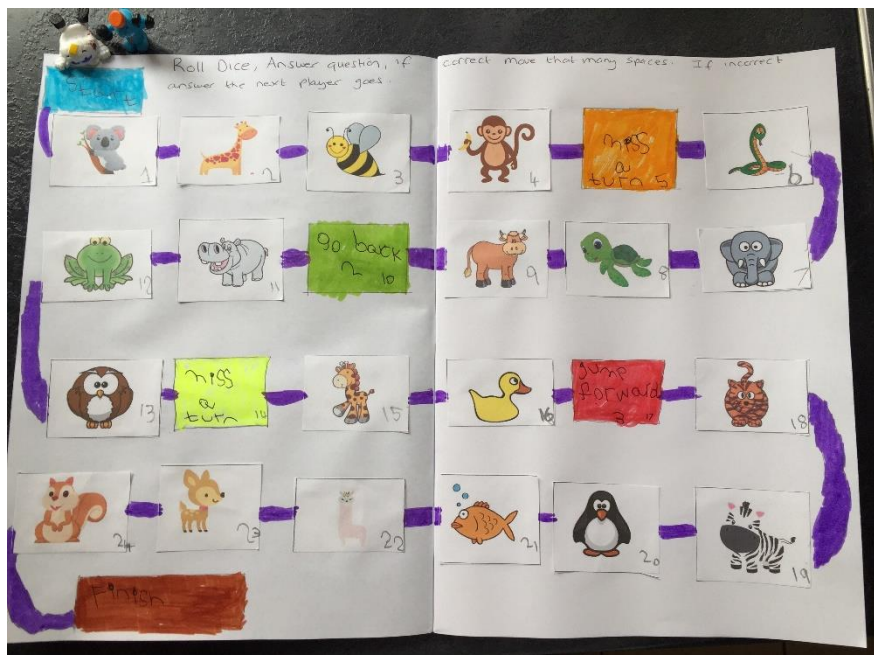
Bella - Year 1 Science experiment

Nathaniel In Nursery painted his crab all by himself. He found different red objects around his home to add the features to his crab.



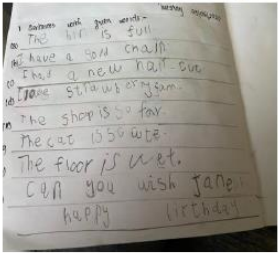

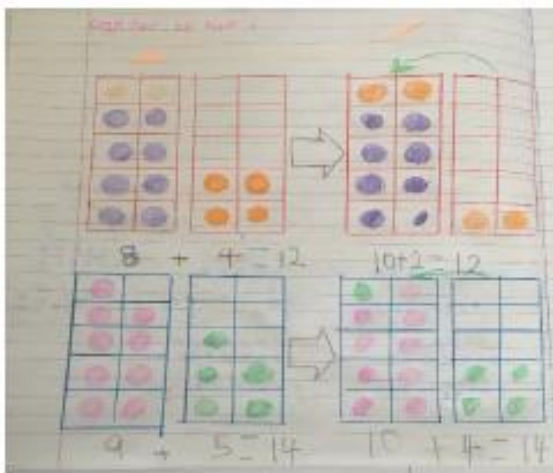


Year 1

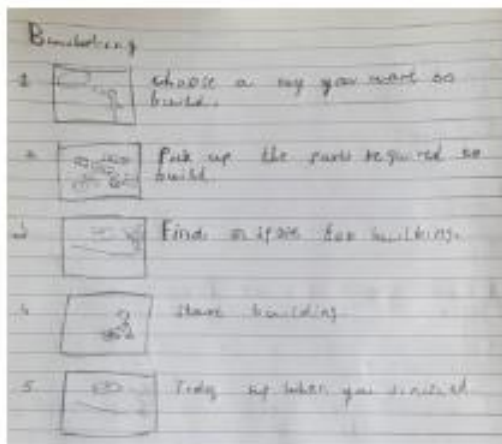

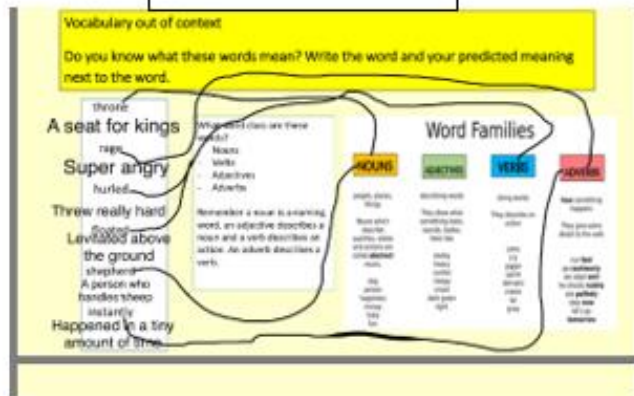

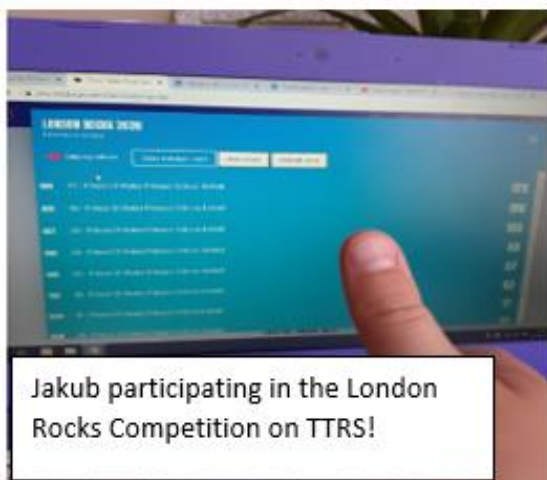

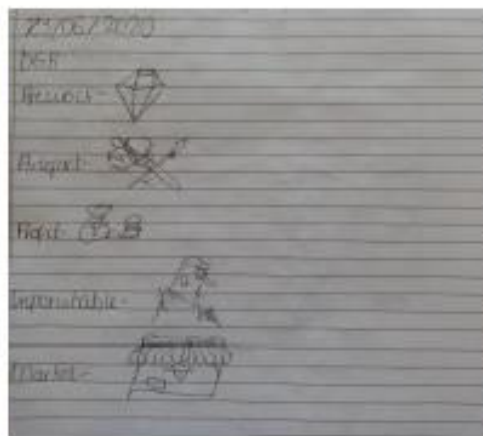
