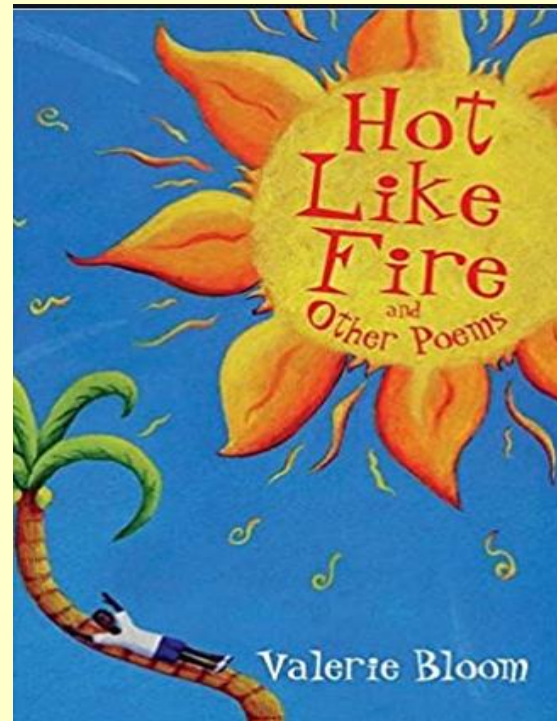

Task 1 – as you listen create an art work of what you are imagining.

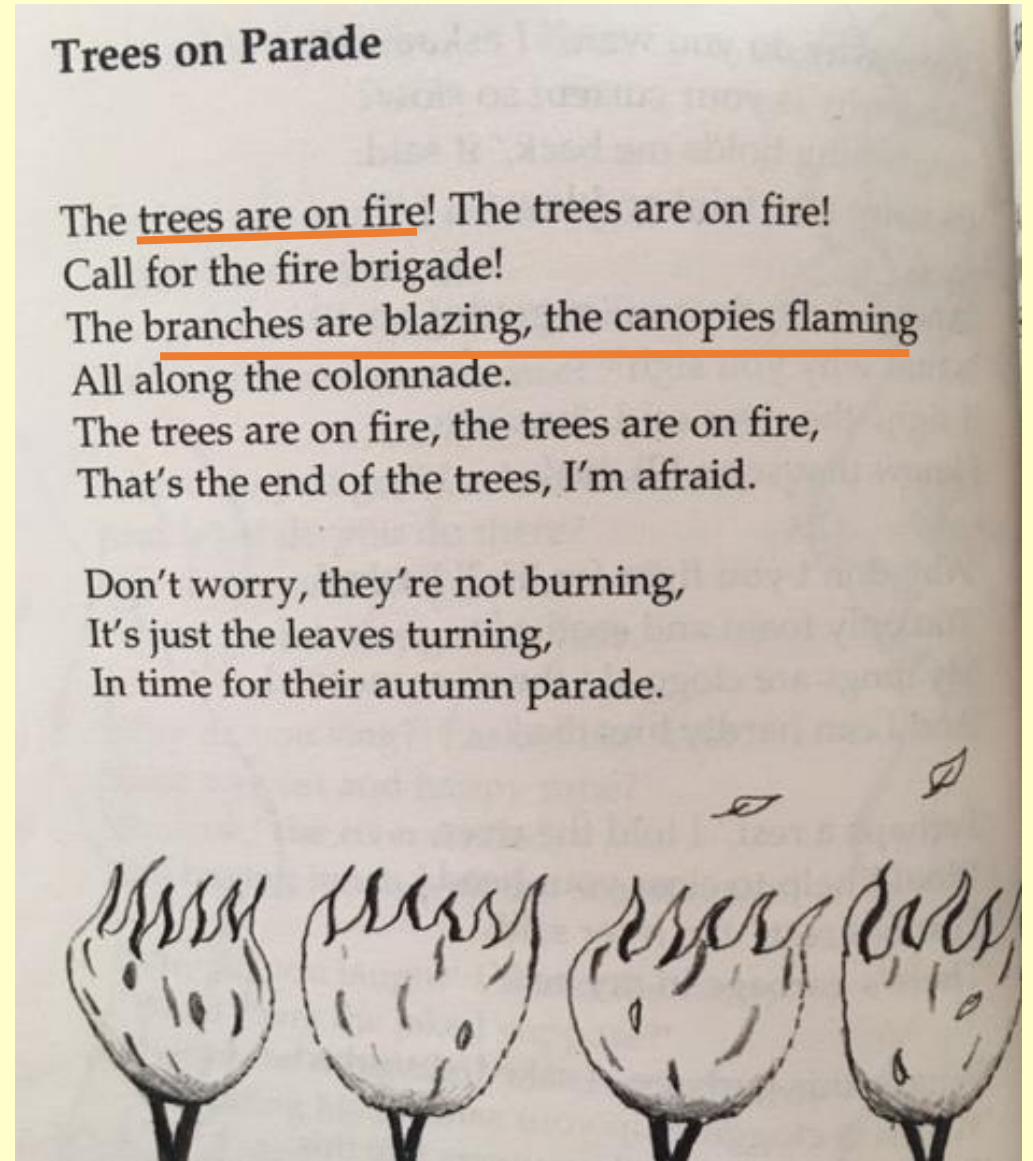
Look at the poem and think about the language used:
