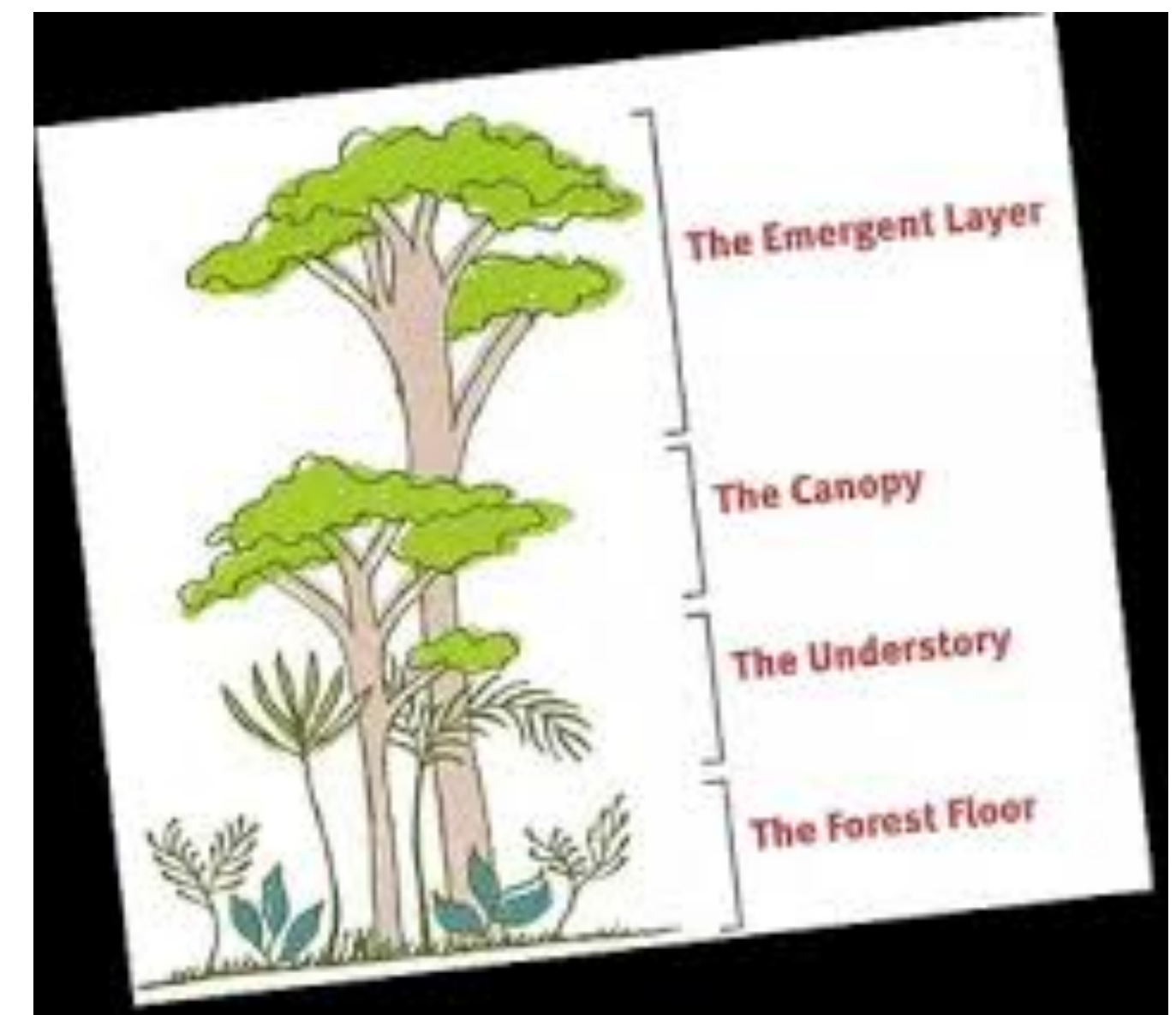
Complete a small research online to find out what species live in the tropical rainforests around the world.

Jaguars are the **largest** big cats in Central and South America. They are strong **predators** and kill all kinds of animals, from small mice to large deer. Unlike most other big cats, they are good **swimmers** and hunt prey such as turtles, water snakes, and caimans (a type of crocodile) in the **rivers** of the rainforest.

THE TOUCAN



The toucan has a long, colorful beak.

It eats fruit, insects, and sometimes lizards.

The toucan is about 20 inches long. Its bill is about 7 1/2 inches long.

It lives in flocks or groups of 5 or 6 birds.

Its bright colors help it to hide in the rainforest.

The toucan's bill helps it to reach food and keep cool.

It sleeps in tree holes in the canopy layer of the rainforest.
