

(If you are confident counting in these steps try 4s or 6s!) First, choose a picture you are going to use. For example, when counting in 2s you might use one of these:



Be as creative as you can!

Once you have chosen an image, either draw them out to make a number line or make it with real objects and then label your number line with the numbers.

E.g. I am going to use a bicycle because it has 2 wheels.



Make a number line for counting in 2s, 3s and 5s. Then practise counting backwards and forwards in this number. You might decide to continue this activity over the weekend!

Top tips! For 5 try: flowers with 5 petals, 5p coins, hands, feet. For 3 try: triangles, 3 leafed clovers or aliens with 3 eyes.
