

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Jumping Squares https://nrich.maths.org/7471



You start on the green square which tells you that you can jump forward either one or three squares.

You make your way round the track and finish on the red square with 'end' on it.

If you land on a square which has 2 and 3 on it, you can jump forward - or back - either 2 or 3 squares.

If the square has 2 and 0 on it, you can jump forward - or back - only 2 squares.

If the square has 0 and 0 on it, you cannot jump at all. You have to go right back to the beginning and start again!

You can count your jumps by making a note on paper whenever you jump or by counting out twenty counters

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Think of a journey you have made to a different place. Might be to a different country or a place in the UK that you have visited/ school trip. Write a recount of that journey.

Remember!

Write your recount in the first person because it happened to you! Eg "I felt excited."

Recounts are written in the order in which they happened.

This is called **chronological order**. Use words such as: **firstly, next, then** and **finally.**

Where did you go?


How did you get there/how long did it take?
