Look at the pictures that Uccello painted. Talk with an adult to answer these questions: Which one do you like? Why?</li></ol>
Mathematics (including times tables)	I can interpret information on a bar graph.	<p>We are continuing our work on interpreting and presenting data and today we are looking at bar graphs using data from The African Savannah.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Using the measurements provided in the factsheet, fill in the table.</li><li>3. Draw a bar chart to show the length of each animal on the bar chart and answer the questions.</li></ol> <p>Challenge: Look at the bar chart on the weight of the animals. Write out at least five different questions that you could ask to help interpret this graph.</p> <p>Extra Challenge! Can you answer your questions as well?</p>
English	I can record ideas	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Write the date and I can in your book</li><li>2. Read the instructions on page 2</li><li>3. Reread the book 'Window'</li><li>4. Choose a picture from the book that you want to write a letter about</li></ol>

		<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>5. Now look at the first step in the plan for the letter (making notes on what you can see from the window)</li> <li>6. Now add to your notes by writing what you think the character could be doing in the picture (see example if you need to)</li> <li>7. Art	I can create my own repeating pattern	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. We are still focusing on 'The Battle of San Romano' by Uccello.</li> <li>2. Watch the video about William Morris as he created many repeating pattern</li> <li>3. Create your own repeating pattern in either the style of Uccello or William Morris</li> <li>4. Fold a piece of paper into four and then repeat your pattern in each quarter of the paper</li> </ol> <p>Don't forget to send a picture to your teacher</p>
