Mathematics (including times tables)	I can count to and across 100, forwards and backwards from any starting point.	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Begin with a number 17, 23, 41 etc. Count forwards in steps of one. Clap your hands as you count. Carry on as far as you can.</li><li>2. Choose a number and count backwards. Count in steps of 1. Pat your hands on your knees as you count backwards.</li><li>3. What does he do at each of the houses?</li><li>3. Act out your favourite parts of the story. Use the pictures below to help you.</li></ol>

What do the leaves on our plants and trees look like at this time of year? What time of year do the leaves fall from some of our plants and trees?</li><li>2. Go for a walk and collect some leaves or print some pictures of summer leaves.</li><li>3. Draw or make a giant leaf like the one below (you can use sticks, stones etc to make the outline) Place or stick the leaves on the leaf to create your own giant leaf.</li></ol>



