## What is he famous for?

In short, Usain Bolt is known as the fastest man on the planet. An eight-time Olympic gold medallist, Bolt is the only sprinter to win Olympic 100 m and 200 m titles at three consecutive Olympics (2008, 2012 and 2016). He also won two  $4 \times 100$  relay gold medals. He gained worldwide fame for his

double sprint victory in world record times at the 2008 Beijing Olympics, which made him the first person to hold both records since automatic timing began.


