#### Agreement for School

#### The school will:

Provide an environment which has been risk assessed in response to COVID-19;

Reduce contact by grouping pupils and avoiding contact between groups;

Provide a curriculum that meets the needs of your child's well-being, mental health and academic needs;

<u>Prioritise</u> identifying gaps and re-establish good progress in phonics and reading vocabulary, writing and mathematics:

Contact parents/carer; if your child displays symptoms of COVID-19, isolate them from other children and supervise them until a parent/carer; can collect;

Continue our clear and consistent approach to rewards and consequences for children as set out in our <u>Behaviour</u> Policy as well the expectations outlined in this agreement;

Communicate between home and school through phone calls, text, email, and the school website:

Ensure that pupils clean their hands regularly.

Engage with the NHS Test and Trace process;

Offer immediate remote education where a group of pupils need to self-isolate or in the event of lockdown.

Read all letters/messages/emails that are sent home and respond quickly if appropriate;

I will inform the school immediately of any changes to parents/carer and emergency contacts details.


#### **Goodbye Year 6**

As a result, you are the first Year 6 cohort that didn't complete KS2 SATs since this was introduced. Your generation has been uniquely challenged in your engagement with learning when not under the direct tutelage of your teacher. Although your participation will have included negotiation at home about time and taking turns on an electronic device, it much depended on your willingness, discipline and your recognition that here was an opportunity for self-determination. Although the weekly attendance figures speak for themselves, I kept a close eye on your communications and achievements at home. They tell me that PoW has done its job with you and is confidently letting you go into the great unknown.






