<b>Communication, Language and Literacy</b>	<p>To have confidence to speak to others about their own wants and interests.</p> <p>To use talk to gain attention and sometimes use action rather than talk to demonstrate or explain to others.</p> <p>To recognise rhythm in spoken words.</p> <p>To understand the concept of a word.</p> <p>To enjoy an increasing range of books.</p> <p>To begin to break the flow of speech into words.</p> <p>To begin to use anticlockwise movement and retrace vertical lines.</p> <p>To begin to learn phonics through RWI.</p>
<b>Mathematics</b>	<p>To recognise some numerals of personal significance.</p> <p>To count up to 3 or 4 objects by saying one number name for each item.</p> <p>To begin to represent numbers using fingers, marks on paper or pictures.</p> <p>To show curiosity and observation by talking about shapes, how they are the same or why they are different.</p> <p>To match some shapes by recognising similarities and orientation.</p>
<b>Understanding the World</b>	<p>To understand about the seasons of the year and their regularity.</p> <p>To notice and comment on patterns.</p> <p>To show an awareness of change.</p> <p>To construct with a purpose in mind, using a variety of resources.</p> <p>To gain an awareness of the cultures and beliefs of others.</p> <p>To complete a simple program on a computer.</p> <p>To begin to differentiate between past and present.</p> <p>To notice differences between features of the local environment.</p> <p>To understand why we celebrate Harvest</p> <p>To learn about the importance of Remembrance day</p>
