Current Enfield COVID position – As of the 30 October 2020, 401 coronavirus-related deaths had been registered in Enfield. 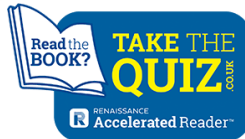

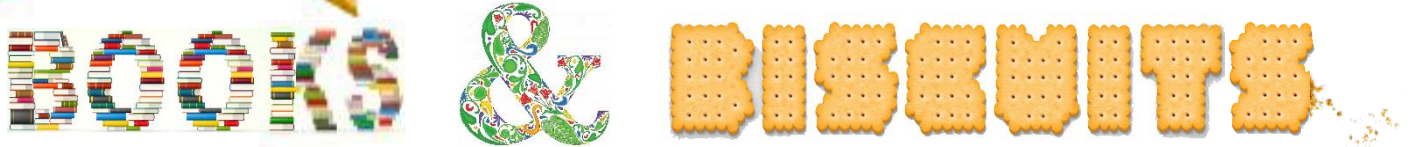

Year 1

Recently in Year 1 the children have been looking at lots of different feelings and emotions. We made a volcano to show anger. In red, we wrote down how we feel and behave when we get angry. While in yellow, we wrote down tips and ideas to help us regulate this difficult feeling so that we are able to calm down and continue moving forward with our day.

We know talking about emotions is important. We began to look at what we can do to stop bullying this week.



In class we spent time talking about bullying and what it is. As a class we came up with ideas of what we can do if we see it happening to someone or it happens to us.

Class 1T made poppies in class and laid them on our archway to remember all the soldiers who died in the wars.

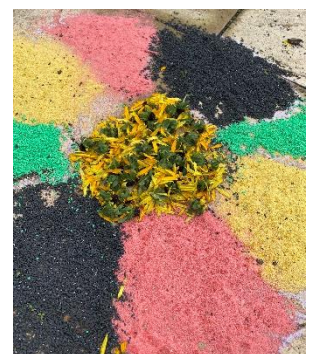


Year 2

Each of us filled in a **Helping Hand** sheet about people to go to if we experience or see bullying.

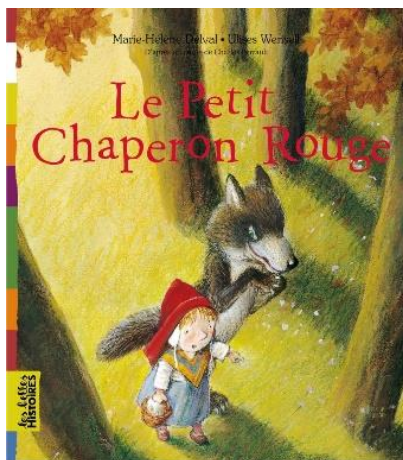
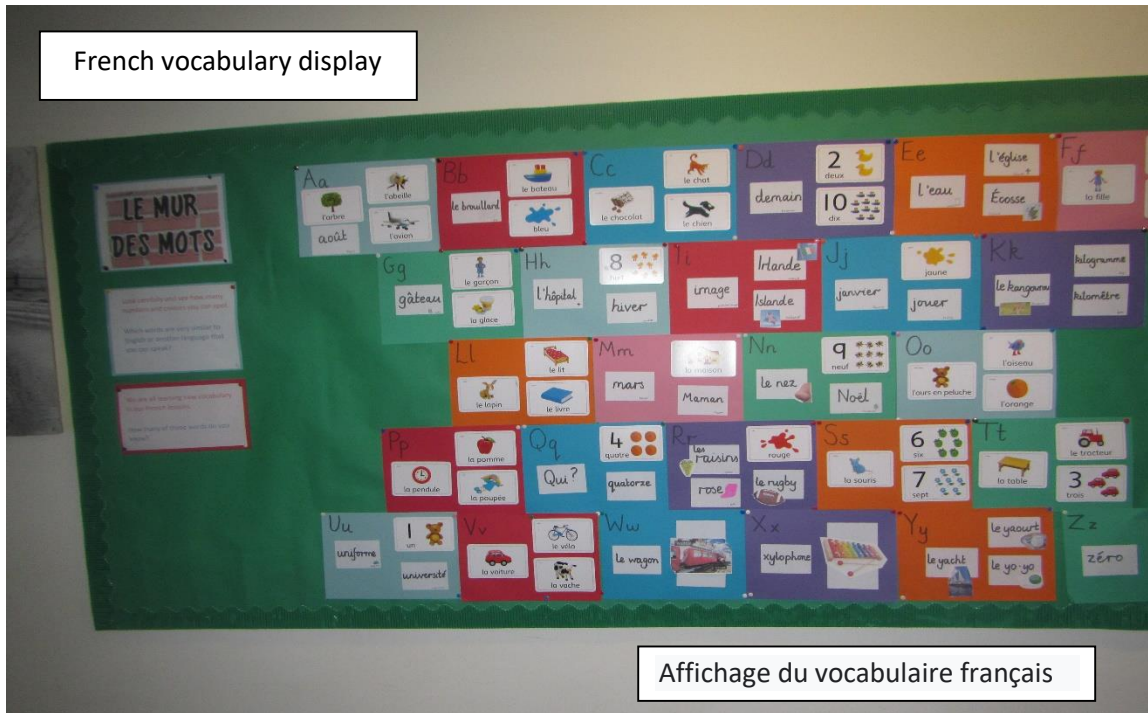

In Years 3 to 6 pupils develop their understanding of French through learning new vocabulary, taking part in role play, listening to songs and to native French speakers.

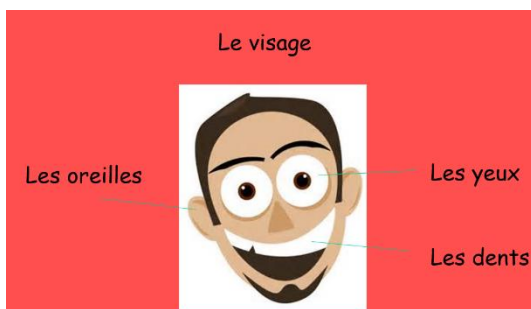


To link with our whole school project on the story of “**Little Red Riding Hood**”, classes have listened to and read the story in French.

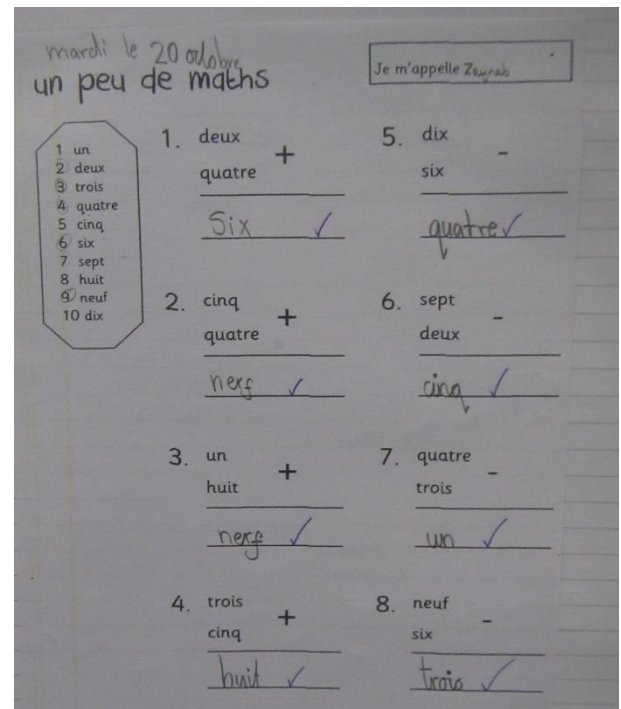

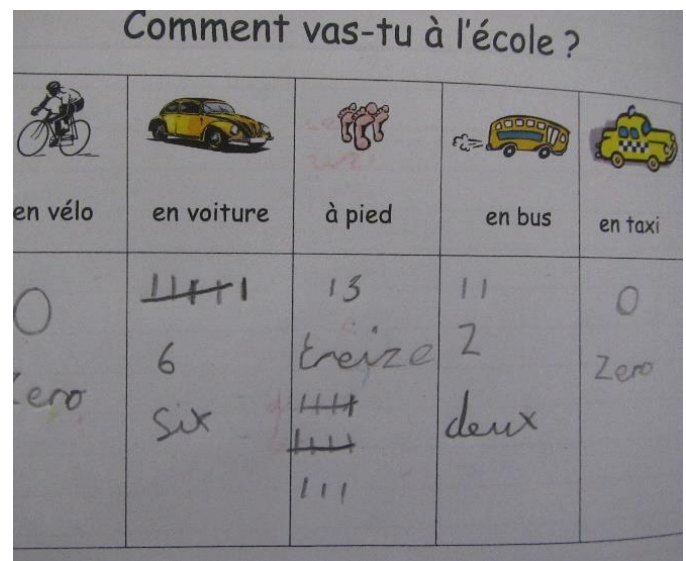
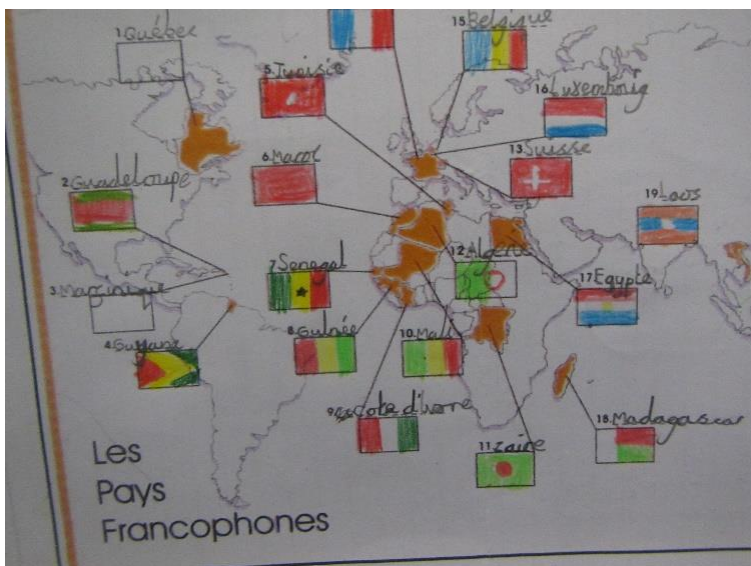
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In Year 3, pupils have been learning how to meet and greet people and also doing sums in French.

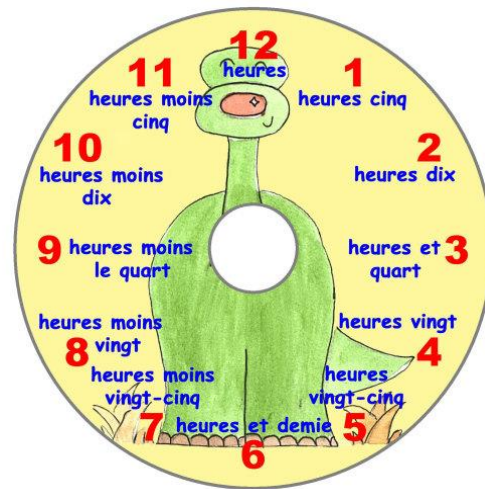
