Current Enfield COVID position – As of the 30 October 2020, 401 coronavirus-related deaths had been registered in Enfield. 

Year 1


Remembrance Day IIth November 2020

Each of us filled in a **Helping Hand** sheet about people to go to if we experience or see bulling.


















In Year 3, pupils have been learning how to meet and greet people and also doing sums in French.






In Year 4, pupils have found out where French is spoken in the World and learnt how to say how they travel to school.






The focus for Year 5 has been on learning and pronouncing the multiples of 10 and writing a description of a journey.









Year 6 pupils have practised numbers from 1-100 and also been learning to tell the time.
